Restoring Women's Dignity

According to the Ancient Law of Moses people who suffered from hemorrhage were considered impure and could not approach others. It was explained that to lose blood was to lose life and such a disease was caused by sin. For this reason, a bleeding woman was not allowed to go the temple, nor touch any one. After bleeding ceased, then she should offer sacrifices for her purification.

The Gospel tells us the story of this woman who had been suffering from hemorrhage for twelve years. Nobody was able to heal her and she was declared lost. With great courage, though she broke the law, she joined the crowd around Jesus and touched His mantle. Immediately the Lord felt a healing energy coming from Him. Many people were pressing on Jesus but that woman had touched Him in a different way, with faith.

By turning towards her and acknowledging her faith as a condition to be made clean Jesus shows us that He cares for everyone. He restored the dignity of this woman giving back her life. In this passage of the Gospel, as in many others, Christ reveals the importance of women in the world and in the Christian community. God made man and woman to be partners and they are to be equally respected. *Fr. Will SCJ*
