Our Goal in this Lenten Season

Lent is a time of repentance, a time to set aside the usual stuff of life in order to take stock of where we are and where we want to go. It is, therefore, no accident that Lent begins with a reflection on Jesus' time in the desert. In keeping with a central theme of his Gospel, Luke says that Jesus was filled with the Spirit and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness.

For Luke, the presence of the Spirit is the evidence that God is with Jesus and that Jesus is from God. It is the Spirit that allows Him to recognise the temptations of the devil for what they are, and it is the Spirit that guides Him in His rejection of the temptation. This is the same for His disciples; we, you and I, can only follow Jesus by an awareness of His Spirit within us. All our Lenten endeavours will be just a waste of time and effort if we are not guided by the Holy Spirit in what we do.

The Gospel for the first Sunday of Lent is always the story of the temptation of Jesus in the wilderness. It is intended to make us think not only about Jesus and His struggle but to help us realise that the history of God's people from Adam and Eve to the present day involves a similar story. The essence of the temptation of Jesus was the idea that He could go it alone, that He could be entirely self-sufficient.

Jesus resisted this because He recognised His complete dependence on the Father. He knew that He needed to be nourished by God's word and that His true destiny lay in His seeking to do His Father's will. When Satan succeeds in convincing us that we have it in our power to save ourselves then we are on the path to self-destruction. Lent is a time for us to humbly take God's hand and to walk the path of faith and love that leads to Easter.

So, what will we do during this Lenten season? What is our goal in this Lenten season?
