The Church is a House of Mercy

In the Gospels the scribes and Pharisees had put Jesus to the test many times. They tried to accuse Him of breaking the Mosaic Law and thus they would have had sufficient reason to condemn Him to death. According to prophesies the Son of God would come to fulfill the Law. If Jesus did not observe the ancient religious statutes He could not be the Messiah. In this context, they brought to Jesus the adulterous woman and asked for His opinion whether they should stone her as it was prescribed in the Book of Deuteronomy (see Dt 22:22).

This trial occurred in the temple, a place of pardon and life. Instead it had become a place of judgment where its leaders legally condemned sinners to death. Jesus observed this unjust reality. He patiently wrote on the ground an uncomfortable invitation: "Let anyone among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." Everyone dropped their stones and left, beginning with the elders.

God does not want the death of sinners; rather He wants them to convert and live. It is important to clarify that Jesus did not agree with the adulteress' sinful life but condemning her to death would have been the victory of sin and evil. Leading her to conversion is the victory of God's love. The Lenten season invites us to be merciful, seek forgiveness for ourselves and not judge those who have sinned. May our Church be a House of Mercy and Reconciliation where everyone finds peace to go and sin no more.


