Easter – A Journey Towards New Life

The Easter Triduum is at the core of our Christian faith. We begin these three very special days with the remembrance of Jesus' Last Supper with His disciples. On Holy Thursday Jesus institutes the Sacrament of the Eucharist giving Himself in the Bread of Life and Chalice of Salvation, His own Body and Blood. On the same occasion, through the gesture of washing His apostles' feet, we understand his New Commandment: "Love one another, as I have loved you". Love is service... Love is life-giving!

After sharing a meal with Jesus, we are invited to accompany Him to the Mount of Olives and keep vigil, as He will suffer His agony. The bare altar and emptied tabernacle will remind us that Jesus will be arrested and die for us. Good Friday is the only day in the year that we do not celebrate Mass anywhere in the world. Rather, we celebrate the Solemn Passion of the Lord contemplating the wood of the cross in which He was suspended. Everyone is invited to adore the Crucified Christ and grieve His death with prayer, fasting and penance.

Then comes the day of our liberation. Saturday evening we celebrate the Vigil of the Vigils, the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. We will light the Paschal Candle representing the Living Christ, Light of the World. After a long time we will be able to sing Glory and Alleluia to the Lord for He rose from the dead and is present in our midst. New blessed water will fill the baptismal font where the catechumens will receive the Sacrament of Baptism, be sealed and confirmed by the Holy Spirit and welcomed to the Lord's Table. With lit candles, all baptized will renew their commitment to Jesus.

This is the beauty of the Paschal Mystery, a continuous journey of suffering, dying and rising again with Jesus. Filled with faith, joy and hope, let us experience it and welcome the new life conquered by the Risen Lord. *Fr. Will, SCJ*
