

A Zeal For God's House

In some countries, people bless themselves when passing by a Catholic church. They know that the church is a sacred place. Jesus also had a profound zeal for the Temple of Jerusalem. He showed a great indignation when He saw that the people of Israel had turned "the house of his Father" into a marketplace. Selling animals in the temple was customary in Jesus' time. The Jewish people considered Jerusalem a faith centre; every year many Jews would travel long distances to offer sacrifices in the Temple. Such sacrifices would usually be an ox, a sheep or a dove, according to the gravity of their sins or based on the economic situation of each family.

Since bringing animals through a long pilgrimage would be too difficult and expensive, vendors were established in the Temple, as well as money exchangers, to provide pilgrims with the animal for sacrifice and whatever else needed to fulfill liturgical obligations. Initially all these services seemed to be very helpful; however, after a certain time, the temple business became a corrupted and unfair system of exploitation. Prices of sacrificial animals rose steeply and they oppressed the poor people. Besides, pilgrims were not allowed to watch sacrificial ceremonies, so they trusted that whatever was purchased would be offered on their behalf. Taking advantage of people's ignorance, vendors were selling the same animal many times over.

This practice was unacceptable to Jesus! "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." He was talking about a new temple where everyone would have free access. Jesus Himself is the temple that will die and rise again in three days. Gathered in Christ's body, the Church as people of God will offer the new sacrifice, pleasing to the Father. Now, material temples are meant to be symbols of a spiritual temple, the body of Jesus, freely given to all of us. Following His example, we are called to have a great zeal for God's house and open its doors to welcome all God's children. This is also part of our Lenten mission! So let everyone return to God's House!

A Reminder

Can we chew gum during Mass?



To answer this question, we look at what the Code of Church Law of 1983, ca. 919 says: "A person who will receive the Holy Eucharist must fast at least an

hour before Holy Communion, meaning not to eat and drink except water and medicine."

Actually, this rule is not difficult to keep because, practically speaking, it means not eating and drinking on the way to church (if the distance between your home and the church is about 30 minutes and if we come to church about 15 minutes before the Mass begins). It really gives honour to Christ who will become our spiritual meal.

Therefore, fasting before welcoming the Eucharist helps us to prepare ourselves for Holy Communion as a whole - body and soul. This fasting strengthens our spiritual focus on Christ, so that we can humbly unite ourselves with the divine Saviour who offers Himself for us.

So, we can't chew gum during Mass.


