Christ is the True Vine

This Sunday's Gospel is a call to strengthen our relationship with Christ to continue to live in Him. The type of relationship that should exist between us and Christ is illustrated using what is natural to us. That is, the relationship between a vine and it branches. As Jesus says: *"I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in them bears much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing."*

No branch can have life or bear fruit on its own, unless it is firmly attached to a tree. Likewise, in our spiritual life and journey as Christians, we cannot do without being firmly attached to Christ the vine, in whose name we were baptized. We are created and called to remain in Christ for a purpose and this purpose is to bear durable fruits in Him.

It means that we can be in Christ for years and still suffer from spiritual lethargy. There must be progress in our union with Him. This progress must be expressed in our trust in Him, in our better knowledge of Him and in our love for Him and for others.

So, instead of a passive life, to be in Christ means to live an active and positive life characterized by charity, peace, holiness, pure reverence and love for God and for our neighbours. In other words, it is possible to bear good fruits in Christ through a good, virtuous life.

Our reflection this Sunday is: how is my relationship with Christ, the true vine? Am I still living in Him? Have I born any good fruit in Christ? *Fr. Aegi Warsito SCJ*

Love is a Kind of Dying

The mystery of Christ is the ultimate truth, the reality toward which all human life aspires. And this mystery is known by love.
