The Widow

The Gospel for this Sunday talks about a widow who has nothing, who is willing to give everything to God and to trust totally in God. This widow is willing to give all that she has to the temple. With this, we are all invited to become more like this widow: willing to have nothing, willing to trust totally in God.

In our journey, sometimes, we are so reluctant about giving, even from what we have in excess! That is what this teaching is putting before us. We need only to look around our room, our house, and our way of living. How willing are we to give up everything?

There are three reasons why we give generously. First, we give because generosity is a good thing. It is the opposite of selfishness. The second reason is that we bear a responsibility for one another. We are indeed a community of faith, then, we bear a responsibility for one another. Third, there is a time and a place to talk about sacrifice. When we talk about sacrificial giving, we need to think about some small ways that we can give up something.

So, people give because they are pressured to do so or embarrassed if they do not or for honour and prestige or to get something in return. But true and generous giving must be sincere and come from the heart. The real value of giving is not measured by the amount given. True giving is the generous giving of oneself, a sort of sacrifice on the part of the giver.

Therefore, today we are invited to look into our consciences and ask ourselves: Do I see God at all in the poor and the rejected? Do I care for those who are in need? Can I be as generous as the widow in the Gospel?
