The Proclamation of a New Time

In today's Gospel Jesus announces the destruction of the temple of Jerusalem. It had taken forty years to build and religious authorities were proud of this magnificent structure, adorned with beautiful stones and symbols dedicated to God. It was to be a place of worship and communion with God and one another. However, the house of God had lost its original meaning as the poor and sinners were no longer welcome. Now the temple of Jerusalem has turned into a centre of power, corruption and exclusion and it was to be destroyed.

Following this tragic revelation, Jesus also speaks of catastrophes and war. He warns His disciples about imminent persecution and betrayal. He asked them to face it with courage for He will be with them. These events need to take place so that a new time of justice and peace will be established. Every evil power shall be eradicated and the Kingdom of God will emerge among the faithful who endured. Therefore, Jesus' words are not to frighten His disciples. Rather they are to encourage and assure them of final victory.

As we prepare ourselves for the closing of a cycle in the Church's liturgy we reflect on the ephemerality of the world. No earthly realities will last forever. One day every human authority will be dismissed. Likewise violence, persecution, famine and war will be over. Even the temple will pass and those who belong to God will worship Him in spirit and truth. As God has spoken through the prophet Malachi, "for you who revere my name the sun of righteousness shall rise, with healing in its wings." Therefore Christians are not distressed by tragedies nor conformed to injustice. We work for God's kingdom and actively wait for Jesus' return.
