Steadfast Faith

"When the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" This question asked by Jesus in today's Gospel is quite disconcerting. Looking at the world of this present time and thinking of the perspectives for the future we may be led to a discouraging conclusion that faith is getting weaker in some families and communities. Some people would say that we are living a crisis of faith in the modern society. It is reflected on the empty churches and growing relativism. As a result, selfishness increasing in human relationships. Nevertheless, the Lord wants to restore our hope. His question is not meant to be pessimistic but an invitation to remain faithful even when we have reasons to desist.

The widow had the right to be heard. According to the Law inspired by God she should be supported and protected by the authorities. The parable, though, presents a judge who did not fear God, nor respected human beings. He cared only about his personal interests. The widow would not be able to grant him any benefit, but after being disturbed by her insistence, he decides to make her justice. God is good and he cares for children, especially the marginalized. He will not delay in granting us his justice. However, we need to remain steadfast in faith, perseverant in prayer as the widow of the parable.

Sometimes God seems to be indifferent to our cry. We have the impression that our prayers are not being answered. Violence and hatred are still present in the world. So we are tempted to ask "Where is God?" God is present in every gesture of generosity and love. God is present when we gather in his name. As Moses' open arms were sustained by Aaron and Hur, our enemies will be only defeated if we support each other in prayer.
