29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

What is our heart's loyalty? In today's Gospel, the Pharisees attempt to trap Jesus by asking about the obligation of paying taxes to the emperor. They know that if Jesus says that taxes should be paid, he would show a loyalty to another authority over their religious authority. But Jesus does not answer as they expect.

"Give... to God the things that are God's." Jesus' answer helps us reflect on loyalties in a new light. What are the things that are God's? Our hearts are made to seek and to glorify God. Our lives are God's! The path of faith is to discover what things we are giving priority to in our lives and to intentionally set God ahead of all of them. We put obstacles in our spiritual path whenever we set *anything* above seeking God in the heart of the Gospel and placing God first in our hearts.

So how do we clear away the obstacles from our path? We acknowledge that the "things that are God's" are *all* things. We owe God our very hearts, first and foremost, uncluttered by other attachments. When something else comes first before God, we have placed ourselves as the first priority. Seeking to discover how our priorities are not first rooted in trust and gratitude for God helps to loosen their hold on us.

Food for Thought

The Secret of True Happiness by Carlo Carretto (1910-1988)

Do you want to know the secret of true happiness? Of deep and genuine peace? Do you want to solve at a blow all your difficulties in relations with your neighbour, bring all polemic to an end, avoid all dissension?

Well, decide here and now to love things and people as Jesus loved them, that is, to the point of self-sacrifice. Do not bother with the bookkeeping of love: love without keeping accounts.

If you know someone who is decent and likeable, love him, but if someone else is very unlikeable, love him just the same. If someone greets you and smiles, greet him and smile back, but if someone else treads on your feet, smile just the same. If someone does you a good turn, thank the Lord for it, but if someone slanders you, persecutes you, curses you, strikes you, thank him and carry on.

Do not say: "I'm right, he's wrong." Say: "I must love him as myself." This is the kind of love Jesus taught: a love that transforms, vivifies, enriches, brings peace.

Love Each Other

by St. Teresa of Calcutta (1910-1997)

Love each other as God loves each one of you, with an intense and particular love. Be kind to each other. It is better to commit faults with gentleness than to work miracles with unkindness.
