

Jesus' Disciple: a Servant

In the Gospel, James and John wanted to sit at the right and left side of Jesus Christ. Jesus' reaction was: "You do not know what you are asking." Instead of talking about glory and happiness, Jesus talked to them about sharing His "cup" and "baptism." The cup was the biblical symbol of great suffering, while baptism signified overwhelming sorrow and pain. This is what it means to be a true follower of Jesus.

The other ten were indignant, because these two went ahead of them in asking the same request and they thought of themselves as more qualified than James and John. Maybe each one of us is also upset because others are ambitious and selfish. If this is our attitude, then, we forget that we, too, are as guilty as they were. We may have been doing the same things with our co-workers and fellow humans. We want to go ahead of them to the extent that we step on them and use them as our stepping stones to reach our goal. We are willing to serve, give our time, talent and treasure as long as we can get something in return.

However, Jesus did not punish the two for asking this kind of request. Jesus knew that they wanted to be in that position because they wanted to rule. But Jesus said: "Whoever wishes to be great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all."

For us today, Jesus reminds us that to be His true disciples, "we have to serve the rest," and meet the needs of others. Jesus' whole life was one of service. If we want to be the number one person, it means that we should be the servant of all. Let us ask ourselves: are we willing to live what Jesus says: "Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant?" What are we looking for? Are we looking for promotion, honour and fame? Do we want to be the boss or do we want to be of service to all?

Let us remember that Jesus becomes our Master because He serves us all. Fr. Aegi SCJ
