To Caesar What is Caesar's and to God What is God's

Today's Gospel reveals the conflict between Jesus and the Pharisees as they put Him to the test with a tricky question, "Is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor?" We know that, in Jesus' time, the people of Israel had been exploited by the Roman Empire. The imposition of heavy taxes had become a concrete sign of Caesar's domination. The emperor had taken the place of God and forced every citizen to worship him. Obviously, this is not God's will for His people. Therefore, the Pharisees expected Jesus to condemn the Roman taxes. In this case, He would be considered subversive and liable to be judged and condemned to death.

Jesus notices their malice and calls them hypocrites. The Pharisees were not truly interested in justice for the poor. They actually accepted the taxation in order to get privileges from the Roman Empire and avoid conflict with Caesar. Jesus shows great wisdom as He asks them for a coin. Caesar's image was impressed on it with all his majestic titles. The coin itself is an offense to God who is the only Lord worthy of adoration. "I am the Lord and there is no other" says the First Reading. So Jesus responds, "give to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is God's". It is time to denounce every unjust appropriation of God's majesty.

God's children were created in God's image and likeness; we belong to Him and He wants the wellbeing of all His creatures. Therefore, everything that harms the life of God's people is unacceptable. Taxes are just when they guarantee the services necessary to provide and defend human dignity. As we come together in community we ask the Lord to help us stand up for God and all that belongs to Him.


