

### A Blind Man

In this Sunday's Gospel, there is a man, Bartimaeus, trying to approach Jesus. He is a blind person. He was hurt not only physically but above all, spiritually and emotionally, because people rejected and isolated him from the community. Jesus knew how painful this was. So, Jesus told His disciples to call him.

Nowadays, there are so many blind people in our society. Some of them are blind physically, but there are many people though they are not blind, we still consider them as blind, but in the spiritual sense.

There are some reasons for this: *First*, is they are not concerned about the plight of poor people. What they look for is their own personal well-being. *Second*, is they always focus on their status in life, that they are poor and could not do anything about it. So, they do not work anymore and lose hope for the future. *Third*, is because of poverty. They make their poverty an excuse to make God secondary in their lives. They are so very busy looking for a living. *The fourth* is because they already have wealth and wish to amass more wealth by exploiting people. *Fifth*, is they want to be the center of attention.

A blind person is searching for a way that they could see the light of Christ or looking for someone with the light of Christ. Bartimaeus used his ears, faith, trust and perseverance to seek Jesus. What about us? We are physically whole, so why not give 100% of our thanks to God in our lives?

### Canadian Bishops Announce \$30M National Financial Pledge to Support Healing and Reconciliation Initiatives



### 27 September 2021 – Ottawa

- The Bishops of Canada, as a tangible expression of their commitment to walk with the Indigenous Peoples of this land along the pathway of hope, are making a nation-wide collective financial commitment to support healing and

reconciliation initiatives for residential school survivors, their families, and their communities. With a target of \$30 million over up to five years, this will include initiatives in every region of the country. The commitment will be achieved at the local level, with parishes across Canada being encouraged to participate and amplify the effort.

Bishop Raymond Poisson, President of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB), expressed hope that these efforts will support meaningful projects across Canada and make a significant difference in addressing the historical and ongoing trauma caused by the residential school system.

"When the Bishops of Canada came together in Plenary last week, there was universal consensus that Catholic entities needed to do more in a tangible way to address the suffering experienced in Canada's residential schools. Comprised of local diocesan initiatives, this effort will help support programs and initiatives dedicated to improving the lives of residential school survivors and their communities, ensuring resources needed to assist in the path of healing."

Funding for projects will be determined locally, in consultation with First Nations, Métis and Inuit Peoples in each region. The Bishops of Canada have committed and tasked themselves to develop national principals and strategy, timelines, and the public communication of these collective initiatives this November.


