"Master, I Want to See!"

We all know how difficult it would be to live with a vision disability. Blind people struggle to get access to some places; they usually need to rely on others to do simple daily tasks such as crossing the street, getting a bus and buying groceries. Even with advanced medicine and technology, accessibility that safeguards the dignity all individuals is still a very important issue today.

In todays' Gospel we hear the story of Bartimaeus, the blind man. He was considered a sinner because of his disability. According to old Jewish tradition, an incurable disease is the consequence of a sinful life. They believed that he must have committed a great sin, so God has chastised him. That's why he is at the roadside begging for mercy. He is marginalized!

Some people tried to stop Bartimaeus but his faith led him to cry out to Jesus. And the Lord asked the very same people to bring Bartimaeus to Him. It seems obvious that the blind man wanted to be healed but Jesus wanted to hear from him: "What do you want me to do for you?" God can help you if you allow Him to do so. Full of confidence and hope, he answered: "Master, I want to see!" and his faith saved him.

Most of us have good physical eye sight. However, the worst blindness is the blindness of the heart that makes us unable to see the needs of our brothers and sisters like those who tried to prevent Bartimaeus from approaching Jesus. They were blind in their hearts. May the Lord who gives sight to the blind open our hearts to all and especially to the marginalized of our time.


