The Greatest Commandments

In this Sunday's Gospel, the scribe puts this question to Jesus: "Which commandment is the first of all?"

Jesus answered that question with the first commandment, and in the same breath, He also added the second commandment. In effect, Jesus is saying that these two are closely connected to the same question, just like there are two sides to the same coin. And just like one side of the coin is not more important than the other, the two commandments complement and complete each other.

In other words, to love God is also to love our neighbour. We cannot say that we love God whom we cannot see and do not love the neighbour that we can see. God and neighbour are like two sides of the same coin.

Oftentimes, we must confess and admit that our top priorities are not what Jesus taught us. Because love is not the most important thing in our lives, and if it is in our lives, then, we are still indeed very far from the Kingdom of God. If our top priority in life is not to love, then, how can I be called son or daughter of God? When we understand that, then we, too, are not far from the Kingdom of God.

So, let us be reminded that if the vertical beam intersects with the horizontal beam, we have the form of the cross. May it remind us to love God with our whole being and to love our neighbour as ourselves.

Our reflection is: how can we express our love of God and in what way? What is the most important thing in our life?

Canadian Bishops Announce \$30M National Financial Pledge to Support Healing and Reconciliation Initiatives



Cont'd from last week..... Bishop William McGrattan, Vice President of the CCCB, articulated the importance of working together with Indigenous Peoples on local goals, timing, and distribution of funds. "The Bishops of Canada have been guided by

the principle that we should not speak about Indigenous People without speaking with them. To that end, the ongoing conversations with local leadership will be instrumental in discerning the programs that are most deserving of support. There is no single step that can eliminate the pain felt by residential school survivors, but by listening, seeking relationships, and working collaboratively where we are able, we hope to learn how to walk together in a new path of hope."

Today's news follows a <u>national apology</u> that was issued by the Canadian Bishops on Friday, 24 September. In the weeks and months ahead, the CCCB will continue to provide updates on this work, as part of a long path towards healing and reconciliation.

The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) is the national assembly of the Bishops of Canada. It was founded in 1943 and officially recognized by the Holy See in 1948.
