A Thankful Samaritan



As Jesus continues His way toward Jerusalem He meets many people in several situations. Every situation is an opportunity for a new teaching. So the "Way to Jerusalem" is like a catechesis given by the Lord before going back to the Father. Today Jesus encounters

ten lepers who were outside Samaria. In this episode of healing we are invited to reflect upon our gratitude for the Lord's blessings in our daily lives.

Leprosy was considered an incurable, contagious illness in Jesus' time. Infected people were isolated on the outskirts of town and were to shout "impure" if someone approached them. Their condition was considered to be God's punishment. So they were left on the margins of social and religious groups with no perspective on life or their future.

Jesus approaches them and the lepers cry out: "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" He commands them to go and show themselves to the priests. Only priests were able to confirm a cure of leprosy and allow the leper to return to a normal religious and social life. With no promise or sign, the lepers trusted and obeyed Jesus. As they went, they were made clean. Ironically, only the Samaritan came back and thanked Jesus profusely for healing him. Samaritans were the enemies of the Jews.

Sometimes people who have received so much take things for granted. They forget that everything we possess is actually God's gift. He continuously shows us His mercy, especially for the poor and marginalized. It's our duty to be thankful for His generous love and presence in our history. On this Thanksgiving Day be grateful for all the Lord has done for you and your family. Happy Thanksgiving! Fr. Will, SCJ
