Why Are You Standing Idle?

In today's Gospel Jesus tells the parable of the landowner who goes to the marketplace seeking labourers for his vineyard. The story says that they were unemployed and "standing idle"; in other words, marginalized, discouraged and hopeless. The landowner hired them all, at different times of the day. When the work was done he chose to pay them equally despite their protest. In a society organized by a capitalist system, this parable may cause some discomfort. It seems to be unfair that those who worked longer will receive the same wage as those who worked for a short time. However, Jesus is using this parable to illustrate the Kingdom of God where everyone will be treated with the same generosity.

"The Kingdom of God is like..." with this common introduction, Jesus tries to explain a reality that cannot be fully comprehended. The Kingdom of God will be more about justice and inclusion than any of our human communities. Look what God says through the Prophet Isaiah in the First Reading, "My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways". In fact, God knows how to grant His children what is good and fair. To envy others shows that we are not grateful for the many blessings that God has bestowed on us.

The parable also reveals that nobody should tell God what to do. He is perfect and all His designs are right. It is necessary to be humble and accept that He is the Ruler and shows compassion to all His creatures. Think of those men "standing idle", they were forgotten and the Lord has saved them. To work in the Lord's vineyard is a privilege! His labourers shall not be greedy but generous, compassionate and grateful. Today He is calling us! Why are you standing idle? Let's come to Him! In the end, our reward will be much greater than what we can imagine. Fr. Willyans SCJ

Are You a Volunteer or Are You Considering Becoming a Volunteer in St. Thomas More Parish?

If you are, there are some points you should know.

All volunteers are required to fill out forms for the ministry or group they want to join or have joined; these forms are available from the leaders. The leaders ensure that volunteers are trained and have all the information they need to fulfill their duties.

The forms are turned over to the Screening Committee, which processes the information and contacts volunteers if necessary.

Some duties of some ministries/groups involve working with vulnerable people (such as young children or sick persons in their homes) or with sensitive information. These volunteers are asked to provide the names and contact information for three persons who will fill out reference forms for the volunteers. Also, these volunteers will be interviewed by members of the Screening Committee and will undergo a security check.

If you are already a volunteer in our parish, you should have an information form on file.

If you are a leader of a ministry or group, you should have an updated list of the members. We know that there will be more changes in some of the lists in the coming weeks but we do ask you to continue to update them regularly. Also, remember to give new or updated volunteer forms to the Screening Committee.

It is important that all leaders submit updated copies of their lists to the office in envelopes addressed to the Screening Committee. The target date is November 1st, but if lists are ready before that, we will be pleased to accept them.


