Chasm Between the Rich and the Poor

Today's Liturgy of the Word continues the theme of last Sunday. It challenges us to reflect on wealth and how we make use of money. Once again Amos in the First Reading and Jesus in the Gospel denounce the greed of the rich and the misery of the poor. Now we see the consequences faced by those who ignore their brothers and sisters in need. Amos said they will be the first to be taken into exile. Jesus said that the rich man was sent to a place of torment after his death.

According to Jesus' parable Lazarus begged at the rich man's door. His body was wounded and even dogs would come to lick his sores. Because of his wounds he was considered an impure man, a sinner. He has been marginalized by both society and religion. Lazarus wanted to eat the bread that fell from the rich man's table. Rich people had a custom of cleaning plates and fingers with bread and then throwing them under the table. Even this bread was not given to him.

God does not forget the poor! Lazarus died and was carried by angels to be with Abraham. The rich man did not have the same fortune. As he suffers his agony in hell he begs Abraham to send Lazarus to satisfy his thirst. It is not possible!

There is a great chasm between Lazarus and the rich man; a chasm that the rich man himself established on earth when Lazarus was laying at his door and never recognized as his equal. Now this chasm extends to eternity.

The whole Scriptures speak of justice to the poor. Jesus himself died for them. Today we ask the Lord to open our minds and hearts that we will not ignore the hungry. As we invite them to our table they will one day welcome us in heaven.
