St. Maximilian Kolbe | Feast Day: August 14

St. Maximillian was born in Poland in 1894. As a Franciscan, he worked to spread the Gospel to his native Poland as well as in Japan. He had a great devotion to Our Lady.

During the Nazi occupation of Poland, he helped thousands of refugees including Polish Jews. He was arrested by the Gestapo in 1941 and imprisoned at Auschwitz. Three months after Maximillian's arrival, a prisoner escaped. In retaliation, 10 men were chosen at random to die. One was a young father; Maximiliian offered to take his place. His offer accepted, Maximillian died on August 14, 1941 and was canonized in October 1982. He is the patron saint of drug addicts, prisoners, families, and the pro-life movement.
