Mary - Mother of God

Our new year opens in the name of our Mother. "Mother of God" is the most important title of Our Lady. But we might ask why we say Mother of God,



and not Mother of Jesus. In the past some wanted to be content simply with the latter, but the Church has declared that Mary is the Mother of God. We should be grateful, because these words contain a magnificent truth about God and about ourselves. From the moment that our Lord became incarnate in Mary, and for all time, he took on our humanity. There is no longer God without man; the flesh Jesus took from his Mother is our own, now and for all eternity. To call Mary the Mother of God reminds us of this: God is close to humanity, even as children are close to the mother who bears them in her womb. — Pope Francis

This weekend we honour the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. In honoring them, we also honor all families, big or small. By honoring all families, we honour the family of God, the Church. But most especially, we focus in on the hidden, day-to-day life of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. Their family



would have still faced the daily hardships, hurt and challenges that face most families, including the illness and death of loved ones, gossip and criticism from others, and the toil of daily work and providing for the family. This is significant because it reveals God's love for family life. God the Father allowed His Divine Son to live this life and, as a result, elevated family life to a place within the Trinity. The holiness of the Holy Family reveals to us that every family is invited to share in God's divine life and to encounter ordinary daily life with grace and virtue. God wants to enter more deeply into your family life just as it is right now. God desires to give you strength and virtue to live as the Holy Family.
