NEW MORNING MASS TIME MONDAYS AND THURSDAYS BEGINNING NOVEMBER 30, 2015

As of the First Monday of Advent, November 30th 2015, our morning Mass on Mondays and Thursdays will begin at **8:30 AM instead of 8:00 AM**. After a consultation with the parishioners who attend Mass on those days, an **overwhelming majority** agree to this change in time. As a result, we will be able to welcome some students from Jean Vanier CHS to come and worship with us. Also, during the dark winter months, a later time with more daylight will increase the safety of parishioners who come to this Mass. For those who find 8:00 a.m. a more convenient time, we would like you to know that St. Mary Immaculate has an 8:00 a.m. Mass every day. Similarly, this time change will also give the opportunity for parishioners of St. Mary Immaculate to attend Mass here at our parish if that time is more convenient for them.

PRAYER GROUP & BIBLE STUDY THE MAKING OF THE OLD COVENANT

The Exodus was the one divine sign that convinced the Israelites that they were God's chosen people. They passed through the waters into freedom and a new identity as God's chosen people. So too, the Christian in baptism is freed from sin and made a child of God. And as the Israelites received manna from heaven and water from the rock, the Christian is given the heavenly bread and spiritual drink of the Eucharist. "Our ancestors...were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea," Paul wrote. "All at the same spiritual food and all drank the same spiritual drink, for they drank from a spiritual rock that followed them, and the rock was Christ" (1 Corinthians 10:1-3).

Despite all the signs and wonders worked by God, Exodus is a story of the people's inability to trust that God was with them. God tests Israel to make it stronger, to teach the people how much they need God. God tested them, Moses said, so that they wouldn't mistake their freedom and prosperity as the work of their own strength. At Sinai, God reveals His full purpose for His chosen people, why He bore the people out of Egypt on eagle's wings and brought them to Himself (Exodus 19:4). God wants His own people to be "to Me a kingdom of priests, a holy nation" (Exodus 19:6).
