Sowing the Seeds of God's Kingdom

When Jesus walked the face of the earth and taught the people in the courtyards and synagogues of ancient Israel, he usually spoke in parables – short stories that conveyed the mysterious wisdom of God. In one of these parables, he compares the Kingdom of God to a mustard seed, “Which, at the time of its sowing, is the smallest of all the seeds of the earth. Yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade” (Mark 4:31-32).

I thought of this parable recently as I noticed all of the wonderful events and activities that take place in our parish and the way in which it has become like the shrub that Jesus describes. That shrub has many branches that give shelter to the people who come here to grow in faith, to find meaning and hope for their lives, and to receive the Word of God and Bread of Life in the sacraments. Like the “birds of the air” who settle in the branches of a tree, I see children marching off at mass for their special liturgy and young people working in the office, reading God's Word, and gathering at the parish centre for evenings of reflection. I see parents bringing their children for baptism and preparation for their first communion and our adults and elders gathering for bible study, song and dance in the parish hall. I see all of God's people gathering at the Sunday masses to give thanks and participate together in the celebration of the Eucharist. What a gift to belong to such a rich and loving community and to know that we are all being sustained by God's presence and care.

As we enter this final phase of our capital campaign, let us give thanks for the immense generosity of those generations that have gone before us in our parish and given us this wonderful building in which to gather. Let us rejoice in the abundance of the funds that have already been raised over the last several months. And let us carefully and prayerfully consider how we too might be called to share of our resources as we restore our parish home for ourselves and future generations. Let us trust that as we sow even the smallest of our own seeds of time, talent, treasure and prayer, God can use that to grow His Kingdom of love and justice in our midst and offer shelter to the people He has called.
