

A Word From Our Pastor:

t is sad that for the most part, we cannot keep our churches open on a daily basis. At one time you could visit a church to pray morning, noon, and night, but this is not the case anymore. With the recent attacks on places of worship this has become even more of a distant memory. Many will also look upon previous times as being more peaceful and feel it was more enjoyable to have lived in a certain era. People may remember that they were friendlier with their neighbours and that people knew each other better. Today many will say that they don't know their neighbours as much or that people are more private.

During the Easter Season, we will read from the Acts of the Apostles which was written by St. Luke. In the vision of the early Christian Church Community, we read of people helping others learn about Jesus and sharing their gifts and possessions with others. Private ownership of things was assumed. However, possessiveness did not exist. Generosity, selflessness, and charity were the rule.

Acts gives us an ideal, a vision of the Christian Community in its perfection. Some say it was never really achieved, but we all have tasted true Christian Community to one degree or another. Most of us have at least some family, friends, or neighbours with whom we hold things in common.

Many of us can identify with the image of St. Thomas. We want to believe in the image of the perfect Christian Community, but like Thomas, we can't bring ourselves to believe it until we see it. Thomas could accept that God was acting among his friends, but it was a stretch to believe that Jesus had bodily and physically entered their locked room. If Thomas made a mistake, it was that he created a stumbling block in his faith life. The stumbling block? Thomas basically put conditions on his faith. "Unless I see... I will not believe." Many will almost bargain or place conditions on their belief in God.

What we must learn is that God rarely meets our conditions as He gives us unconditional love. However, Jesus did meet Thomas' condition, not so much for the sake of Thomas but for us. Thomas came to faith quickly, but Jesus also gave Thomas a command: Do not be unbelieving but believe!

On this Divine Mercy Sunday, we are called to give in to our yearning for God. We must avoid the conditions we place on God. If we can allow God to be God and trust Him unconditionally, despite reasons not to, the peace Jesus offered to the Apostles can be ours as well.




