

### A Word From Our Pastor:

n dealing with the Covid19 pandemic, the Church has had to modify or out right cancel certain aspects of the traditions of our Faith. One of these is the presentation of the gifts which initiates the second part of the Mass, the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

One may feel that this part of the Mass is insignificant and that it hardly brings a sense of focus to the Mass; however, the Gospel of this week reminds us of the importance of this ritual act. Here we have a picture of the Church as it acts in every age. Jesus did not feed the stranded crowd at the edge of the Sea of Galilee all on his own. He accomplished it with the help of his disciples, who were hesitant to accept responsibility for the hungry people. Their first reaction was to send the crowd away to fend for themselves and let someone else deal with the problem, Jesus reminds them that they have five loaves and two fishes which they brought to Him. The little which the disciples had was sufficient for Jesus to use for all.

The five loaves and the two fishes are symbols of the power for goodness which we all possess. The bread and fishes may seem small in our eyes, but it is what the Lord has given us and expects us to use in His service. The gift may be our ability to be a good neighbour, a caring listener to a sorrowing widow, or a willing member within one's parish setting. In whatever way we minister to the needs of others, we show forth the compassion of Christ and His friendship.

Bringing of the gifts may be on hold presently, but when this ritual is resumed, let us be mindful of the significance of the act. Jesus receives our gifts in the same manner as he accepted the fives loaves and the two fishes from the disciples, and offering them to His Father, gives them eternal value.
