

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

Here are many today who are interested in their ancestry background and where they came from. Commercials talk about an individual who discovered certain aspects of a relative who lived over a hundred years ago or perhaps immigrated to another country. There have also been television shows depicting a celebrity searching for family members from the past. There is always a [part of the show which brings an interesting reaction from the celebrity as something about the relative which they did not know about is revealed.

We may also identify with a certain characteristic of our ethnic background. Unfortunately, sometimes people may be unfairly labelled by a certain trait of their ethnic background which is not right or proper. Being of some Irish descent one may be aware of having their 'Irish up' which means losing one's temper. Others may be identified by other characteristics of their background.

What one never hears of is having their 'Christianity up' or that's their 'Catholicism in them'. If people can identify us by certain ethnic characteristics, then they should be able to identify or recognize us by our faith as well. This is not always the case for people who are indifferent or embarrassed about their faith and their relationship with God.

In this Sunday's Gospel, we have the familiar phrase, "For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be." If we can accept this statement, we can find a way of showing others who we are. What is interesting about this phrase is that it also appears in the Gospel of Matthew. Even though these words appear in both Gospels, they are not the same in translation. In Matthew, the word 'your' means an individual, the person. In the Gospel of Luke, the Evangelist is using the word 'your' as being identified with the plural or in other words, the whole heart of the community, not just individuals.

The question needs to be asked, "Where is the heart of our Christian community?" Can outsiders look at our parishioners and immediately tell where our heart is? Is a parish invested in caring for those in need? Is the parish willing and able to spread the good news of the Gospels? What does our community of faith treasure?

What can also help is to look at the image of the steward in the Gospel. Yes, the steward was a slave, but he was entrusted with looking out for others and to be aware of their needs. We are to be alert and attentive. Jesus made us

stewards of God's Kingdom. He brought the Kingdom into the World giving us the mission of caring for it and making it grow. This was a mission given to His Church, to communities of faith.

Can people observe the treasures which we possess in our lives? Are our hearts in the right place in our relationship with God? We are invited to search, explore, and ultimately find these treasures through God.






