

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

e are now in the shortest period of the year regarding darkness and light. It is enjoyable to drive around and see the Christmas lights which people have put up. I was reading a story this week where a teacher asked her students why it got dark so early at this time of the year. One of the students responded quickly, "so the Christmas decorations on people's houses look prettier on our way home!"

This a cute story, but we are reminded that Christ has come and will come again. The light is here, and we should rejoice. This Third Sunday of Advent is known as Gaudete Sunday which teaches us that the Lord is near and that we should rejoice at His coming.

If we need an example of the light of Christ, we just need to look at a Feast Day that we celebrate this upcoming week: St Lucy (December 13). This saint is often depicted in Christmas art and on Christmas cards. Lucy is seen as a girl wearing a white dress with a sash of crimson and a crown of branches set with lighted candles on her head. Her name comes from the Latin word for light.

We don't know much about Lucy. She is one of the Martyrs mentioned in the Roman Canon (Eucharistic Prayer I). However, beyond that there is not much information about her. Lucy's association with light comes because she certainly had the light of faith. She clearly saw Jesus as the Messiah, and she understood that her faith in Jesus would sustain her even through death. The candles shown on her head in art remind us of the light of faith and how it can lead us through everything.

Regarding the Gospel of this weekend, many of those who went into the desert to see and hear John the Baptist had their eyes opened. They were so taken up with the message of the coming of the Messiah, they instinctively knew that somehow, they should be living differently than they had been living. It was a moment for them when the light went on.

On this Gaudete Sunday, we are reminded that the Light is near, and we should be rejoicing that Christ is present. St. Paul said it best in our second reading, that we are called to discover the goodness that exists around us and to enjoy the Light that reveals its beauty. Let us rejoice!




