A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

ith Christmas less than a week away, the days of Advent anticipation are almost over. On this Forth Sunday of Advent, the Scripture readings are alive with excitement about the Saviour who is coming very soon. The visitation of Mary to her cousin Elizabeth is more than a happy exchange of support between the women sharing the joys of childbearing. It is a story of faith as well as friendship and human love. Elizabeth clearly recognizes that Mary is carrying Jesus the image of the unseen God when she says: "Why should I be honoured with a visit from the Mother of My Lord?" What a warm welcome the unborn Christ Child received at Elizabeth's home in contrast to the weak welcome He would receive in Bethlehem when there was no room for them in the inn.

Both Mary and Elizabeth can teach us lessons on this Sunday. Mary was a relatively insignificant person. She was a young girl from a small village. Her responses to both the Angel Gabriel and to Elizabeth let us know that even Mary considered herself insignificant. This by no means meant that Mary suffered from 'poor self esteem' She was simply humbled knowing that she was from a poor family in a poor village. This should remind us that being from insignificant families in insignificant places does not make us insignificant. We need to see that the idea of significance does not come from places or families. Our significance comes from God. All human life is significant. This was the message of God's choice to become human and enter our world.

Elizabeth gives us the lesson of what we can do for those who are alone or feel abandoned or suffer at this time of year. Elizabeth made clear that she recognized that her young cousin from a small village was significant.

The Gospel of this Sunday contains in a capsule, the whole Gospel message. Elizabeth's acclamation of faith tells us who Jesus is. The reaction of the not yet born John the Baptist becomes another statement of faith in the importance of Jesus. Elizabeth herself stepped aside to point to the significance of Mary and especially the Child she carried.

As we approach the Incarnation, we need to see that tow expectant women can always teach us to "wait in joyful hope for the coming of Our Saviour Jesus Christ".


