Feast of the Holy Family

would like to take this opportunity to wish all of you, the Parishioners of St. Joseph, Christmas Blessing at this time. These blessing also extend to your families as well.

Obviously, this has been a very difficult year for us, both as a parish community and as part of the general population. Still, we have much for which to be thankful and we need to remind ourselves of the joy and hope for our lives which the birth of our Saviour can bring.

Still, many are fearful of what this world can present to us. The real meaning of this feast is about giving up our fears. Most especially, this is a feast that helps us to free ourselves from the fear of striving to be fully human. If we are honest with ourselves, we will admit that we are not good risk takers. However, we are made in the image and likeness of God, and our humanity must somehow come to resemble God.

In becoming one of us, Jesus taught us many things, and among them, He taught us how to be human the way God had intended us to be. When we read or hear the Nativity story, we see the shepherds in the fields, and "the Angel of the Lord appeared to them and the Glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were struck with great fear." However, God assured them that they were the first to hear of the birth of Our Saviour. These were individuals not seen as kindly pastoral men. They were considered to be among the lowest in society, not to be trusted, and in many cases, feared for being unscrupulous and thieving. Their humanity was anything but what God had intended when He created us. But it was to just such as these that the message of God entering our world as one of us was first proclaimed.

On this Christmas Day, let us pray that our fears will subside and that we can be enveloped by Light. We must see that we are wrapped in God's love. With Jesus becoming one of us, we can be unafraid of following Him into the warmth of the Light.


