

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

he Gospel for this Sunday ends with Jesus speaking to His Disciples about the Beatitudes. One can see that this passage is very timely for the modern world. With the advancement of 'social media' we have seen the rise of people expressing their opinions, conspiracy theories etc. Many will use social media to express gossip and negative thoughts towards individuals and groups. It's no exaggeration to say that gossip is the most vicious and dangerous type of talk no matter what forum it is presented on. All this business of passing on scandalous takes about people, does untold damage as it results in tearing reputations to shreds. All who have been victimized by this mentality know the pain which can be inflicted.

Socrates, the Greek philosopher, stated that nature has given us two ears, two eyes and only one tongue so that we should hear more than we speak. We were taught as children, if we cannot say something good about another person then it is better to remain silent. Isn't it refreshing when we meet someone who isn't interested in people's failing but only in their good points?

Jesus is challenging His disciples to be aware of who leads them in their lives. Jesus warns them as He warns us about such leaders who presume to guide us in matters that they do not personally understand or believe. If disciples choose leader who do not believe, they will remain blind.

Luke, in his Gospel, is not saying that human imperfections make a person unqualified to be a leader. What Luke is saying, is that the real blindness is when we are blind to our own flaws; the inability to be honest with ourselves, that is the real blindness of which we need to be aware. One should never seek to follow someone who doesn't recognize their own flaws.

If one is honest with themself, they will come to the realization that it is only with God's help that these shortcomings can be overcome. Our call today is to never be afraid to approach Him.




