

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

s we enter the month of February, we are only one month away from the beginning of Lent (March 2). There is no preparation for Lent, it just arrives. It literally interrupts the course of the Sundays in Ordinary Time. As Lent is itself a time of preparation, a time to prepare ourselves for the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ, it would be a little strange to have a preparation time for a preparation time. In saying this though, we should start thinking about Lent. Is it going to make a difference this year?

Last week, in the Gospel, we saw Jesus as being the source pf truth. Jesus saw people clearly as they really were. Knowing what was in their hearts, Jesus explained the Scriptures, making His listeners compare their behaviour to what they themselves knew to be true. Being forced to see their own lies made people angry and they rejected Jesus.

This week we have both Isaiah and Peter having the experience of seeing the truth and believing in it. They saw God, and they saw themselves as they were, sinful and unworthy of an experience of God. Yet, ultimately, they reacted differently from last week's crowd. Although afraid, Isaiah and Peter did not reject God. They did not become angry because they feared change. Instead, they were transformed. They faced their fear of meeting God and found that for which we also long, joy.

When Isaiah was touched by God, he could not wait to share his experience with the world. God was looking for a prophet to transform a fallen Judah, and Isaiah could not wait to volunteer, even though he knew that to preach God's Word would involve hardship and rejection.

Peter, not overly religious, was a bit skeptical of this Teacher who came his way. He resisted the Man initially but decided to give the Man a chance to make His case, regardless of what seemed an absurd request. In this choice, Peter found Jesus, and initially he too was frightened. Often a person refuses to give God and the Church a chance to teach them. One's own skepticism about God of the Church can keep them from ever really finding God in their lives. As we approach Lent, what is it that keeps us from leaving things behind in order to follow Jesus? Isaiah and Peter overcame their fears to follow God. We are called to follow in their footsteps.
