

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

n the Diocese of Hamilton, Bishop Crosby has declared this Sunday to be Bible Sunday as we begin to read and pray the Gospel of St. Luke. This weekend should remind us of the importance of scripture and how it can enrich and nourish us as God speaks to us.

The Gospel of this week is very appropriate for Bible Sunday as we see Jesus reading the scroll given to Him in His hometown Synagogue. Not only does Jesus read the word of God, but He also 'proclaims' it, which gives the people hope and the belief that God is revealing His mission in their midst through His Son. This is an image that we need to hold onto as well. God continues to reveal Himself through the scriptures on a regular basis.

One thing which we can learn from this Gospel passage is that Jesus proclaimed this scroll within a gathering of people in prayer. This suggests that we can begin to discover who we are within our own community of prayer. This is where God's word is proclaimed, and this is where our response begins.

As we begin reading from St. Luke, we should identify some themes we will come across this upcoming year. Many will notice that unlike the other Gospels, Luke's is one which shows historical names and events. Even in his prefaces he writes of recording all that had happened to Christ while He was on Earth. Luke mentions eyewitness accounts as being the source of his words. One can easily get caught up in the notion that this Gospel is basically a historical book. One must remember that not only is Jesus someone of whom it is important to know, even someone of whom it is important to imitate. He is also someone in whom it is important to believe. This is what Luke truly wants us to understand and to grow with.

Also appropriate for Bible Sunday, is that Luke teaches us that salvation is announced in scripture. He shows us that the Good News is proclaimed to the poor and marginalized. The prominence of women disciples, including Jesus' mother Mary, is an important theme

throughout the Gospel. Luke shows Jesus as being a Prophet King, God's Chosen Servant, the Son of Man, and the Saviour of the World.

These are just some of the aspects from the Gospel of Luke which we can discover through Scripture during the upcoming year. On this Bible Sunday, let us be strengthened by the words of Christ. He came to save us and for us to believe in Him.




