

A Word From Our Pastor:

e are coming to the end of another Christmas Season. This year because of the way the calendar is, we are celebrating a shorter season. We were blessed to have a full four weeks of Advent with Christmas being celebrated on Sunday. Regarding the Christmas Season, when the Solemnity of the Epiphany is celebrated on the 7th or 8th of January, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord follows the very next day, unlike the following Sunday, hence we lose out on a full week of the Christmas Season. We have the same scenario next year when the Epiphany is celebrated on the 8th.

With the Epiphany and Baptism being closely celebrated this year, it is a good opportunity to attempt to connect both the Solemnity and the Feast. With the death of Pope Benedict XVI this past week, I had the opportunity to locate words which the late Holy Father spoke in a homily in 2009 about the events which we celebrate this seek. "These are all signs through which the Lord never tires of repeating: 'Yes, I am here. I know you. I love you. There is a path that leads from me to you. I look forward to another year to serve you as your Parish Priest. May God bless all of you and let us pray for the repose of the soul of Pope Benedict who served the Church faithfully throughout his life.


