

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

hat better introduction could we have to prayer than the direction given to us by Jesus, who is the Master of the art of prayer? Throughout his Gospel, Luke always shows Jesus as being in deep private prayer. The success of His daily activity flowed from prayer.

Jesus' approach to prayer made His Disciples aware of its significance, hence they wanted their own prayer. It was not uncommon for rabbis to teach their disciples very specific prayers. The prayers would be unique enough to a particular rabbi that if you heard a person uttering the prayer you would be able to identify the individual as a follower of this rabbi. It was the same for the disciples of John the Baptist. We do not know the prayer that John's disciples expressed, but the Gospel of today states that Jesus' Disciples knew of it, and they wanted their own.

Jesus was happy to oblige. He said something new as He began His prayer for the Disciples. He used the word 'Father'. This was not a formal title as we would use to address a priest. In teaching His Disciples how to pray, Jesus taught both them and us something of our unique relationship with God. We are reminded that He gave it to us to use. It was an act of love that enabled Jesus to share with us His special relationship with His Father. Through this relationship, we have been invited to move closer to God. God is the giver of all life. He is our Father as well, and we are His children. By receiving this gift of the name for God, we know more than who God is. We know what He is.

No one could be more intimate with God than Jesus. With Him telling us to pray as He did, to His Father, He has made our relationship with God more intimate.

Prayer is not as hard as we sometimes think, and it does have its rewards. We can simply begin by saying 'Father'.

"Walking Together" - Papal Visit to Canada

July 24 to 29, 2022 The Holy Father will visit Canada from July 24 to July 29, 2022. Pope Francis' historic visit to Canada will provide an opportunity for the Pope to listen and dialogue with Indigenous Peoples and to address the impact of residential schools in Canada.

The Holy Father will begin his visit by traveling to Edmonton, Alberta, then to Quebec City, St. Anne-de-Beaupré and then to Iqaluit, Nunavut.

Drawing on the theme, "Walking Together", the Holy Father's journey of reconciliation, healing and hope includes visits to a former residential school, Indigenous pilgrimage sites, and several private and public events, including two public Masses.




