

A Word From Our Pastor:

hese past few weeks I have been hearing the First Confessions for the children who will be receiving Holy Communion for the first time in May. The children have been well prepared for the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and I look forward to their First Communion Mass.

With this thought in mind, I was reading a story of a priest who was visiting his parish's second graders. The priest asked the children why they thought God had made us. There were many answers, some serious and some funny, but one was striking. A child said that "God made us so He would not have to be alone." Though it sounds good, the second grader's answer was not correct. God has never been alone and will never be alone. He lives in a community of Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, so it is impossible for Him to be alone. God is always in a relationship of love that we can only guess about, and that human imagination cannot fathom.

It is us who can be lonely, isolated from others, and more importantly from God Himself. Luke, in our Gospel for this week, brings us a story of reconciliation. The community for which he wrote had some members become discouraged and had returned to pagan ways, however; many wanted to return to the Church. This became a problem, especially when persecution developed and war between Jerusalem and Rome broke out. Those who had stayed faithful despite persecution and hardship, those who had maintained their discipline, were not willing to allow the others to return to the fold.

Luke attempted to remind the faithful members that yes, those who had strayed, even those who had strayed badly, should be welcomed back. In fact, as is often the case when we see the word 'house' in a Gospel passage, the house stands for the Church. The forgiving Father left the house and went to meet the Prodigal Son to welcome him and restore him to the house, that is, the Church. The Prodigal Son became lonely, isolated, and hungry. A return home reversed that.

Our Sacrament of Reconciliation is God's gift to us. It is given, not so that God could be reconciled to us, but that we might be reconciled with God. Sin can make us very lonely. It can even destroy us We have been reconciled to God through Christ so that we will never be apart from God. Reconciliation leads to better relationships and ultimately it leads us back into the Father's House.

Let us pray for our Grade Two students as they prepare for their First Holy Communion and that we assure them that they are never alone when they are in the Presence of God.




