

A Word From Our Pastor:

couple of days ago (October 22) we celebrated the optional memorial for Saint Pope John Paul II. Most of us would identify him as being the Holy Father we would recognize the most. He was one of the longest serving Pontiffs in the history of the Church, 1978-2005.

Personally, he is the Holy Father with whom I identify the most because it was during his reign that I was ordained into the Priesthood. Many who were ordained during the reign of Pope John Paul would feel the same way. Many seminarians of the mid to late 1980's were inspired to enter the seminary by the Holy Father's visit to Canada in 1984. It was a wonderful experience for Canada and for Catholics in particular. I feel that we could not recapture that moment of spirit which Pope John Paul brought to our country.

Pope John Paul II was a pontiff who brought a sense of direction to the Church and to its people. The Church after the Second Vatican Council had become 'rudderless' in many ways. Any priest who was ordained in the 1960's or 70's could tell you this. Being in the seminary in the 1980's and early 1990's, one could see a change in teaching and structure within the seminary. We were always told that Pope John Paul saw a need and had a desire to change and refocus what the seminaries around the world were teaching.

Pope John Paul II was also someone who inspired his people through his own personal sufferings and the crosses which he bore. He continues to guide the Church even though the last years of his pontificate were ones of struggle due to declining health. Still, he continued to lead, and for this he should be admired.

We will close with a prayer for Saint John Paul II:

O God Who are rich in mercy and Who willed that St John Paul II should preside as Pope over Your Universal Church, grant, we pray, that instructed by his teaching, we may open our hearts to the saving grace of Christ, the sole Redeemer of mankind, Who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.

Pope Francis' Intention for October:

In his prayer intention for October 2020, Pope Francis asks everyone to pray that women be given greater leadership roles in the Church.

No one has been baptized a priest or a bishop. We have all been baptized as lay people.

Lay people are protagonists of the Church. Today, it is especially necessary to create broader opportunities for a more incisive female presence in the Church.

And we must emphasize the feminine lay presence because women tend to be left aside.

We must promote the integration of women, especially where important decisions are made.

We pray that by the virtue of baptism, the laity, especially women, may participate more in areas of responsibility in the Church, without falling into forms of clericalism that diminish the lay charism.


