

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR:

s we begin a new month on Monday with the Solemnity of All Saints, we are called to honour and celebrate those who were faithful to God and have gone before us.

The Church has traditionally used the month of November as the end of the year, liturgically and in a seasonal way as well. We just need to look around, the clocks 'fall' back an hour next week, which makes the days shorter and darker. We may have the inclination to look on November with a touch of despair, fallen leaves, rain, dampness, with little else ahead but the dismal winter. The Solemnity of All Saints is meant to be a ray of sunshine at the beginning of these dark days. All Saint's Day brings to mind the ordinary people down the ages who were friends of God. They are not canonized saints; however, God remembers them and the faithful, good works they have performed.

These were ordinary people from all walks of life who in their day tried to live the Christian life to its fullest. They were like us; in that they experienced the trials and struggles of normal lives. Still, they accepted that God loved them and relied on the strength of that love more than anything else.

Popular opinion places holiness beyond something which we can even reach. 


