

A Word From Our Pastor:

his upcoming week we celebrate the Feast of St John Chrysostom who is considered to have been one of the greatest preachers in Church history. 'Chrysostom' means golden tongued and refers to the eloquence of his preaching. His sermons were so powerful and well received that they were often interrupted by applause from the congregation.

The recognition of the great saint is appropriate because the Hamilton Diocese Clergy Seminar was held this past week. The theme was preaching which goes without saying is an important part of the Mass and how it brings the Word of Christ to those who hear a sermon. When this bulletin message went to press, I was in the middle of the seminar, so I can't comment on how it went. Hopefully it was an opportunity for the priests of this Diocese to learn and grow with their preaching.

In the Second Vatican Council it was stated that the purpose of sacred preaching is 'conversion and holiness'. Pope Benedict XVI wrote: "The homily is a means of bringing the scriptural message to life in a way that helps the faithful to realize that God's Word is present and at work in their everyday lives. It should lead to an understanding of the Mystery being celebrated, serve as a summons to mission and prepare the assembly for the Profession of Faith, the Universal Prayer, and the Eucharistic liturgy."

These lofty words can be challenging to a priest or deacon as he prepares a homily. It is important that the homily allows the listener to be inspired to a greater faith, to prayer, to communion with God and to share in the Gospel effectively with others. Do the words of a homily allow for someone to be attracted to God's voice and to act upon His grace and Call? These are some of the thoughts which a homilist needs to ask himself as he prepares his homily. A good homily takes time, preparation, and most importantly, prayer. A priest or deacon who does not ponder these questions or put them to prayer, will become indifferent to his preparations and the quality of his homilies received by his audience. Yes, there are many times when the homily is not great or inspiring, no one can be good every time one preaches, but it is important to strive to share the Good News with others who are searching and are hungry for the Word of God.

The point of a homily is not just to give us something upon which to reflect for the week or to make us feel good. Rather, it's a challenge to both the homilist and his audience to become Christ-like, so that we respond, as Mary did "Let it be done to me according to Your Word." This is our call, to respond to the Word of God and to act upon it.




