This is the foundation of the morality given to man by the Creator: the Decalogue, the ten commandments of God pronounced resolutely on Mount Sinai and confirmed by Christ in the Sermon on the Mount, in the context of the eight Beatitudes. The Creator, who at the same time is the supreme law-giver, has inscribed on the human heart the whole order of truth. This order determines what is good, provides a foundation for the moral order and constitutes the basis of the dignity of man created in God's image. The commandments were given for the good of mankind, for man's personal good and the good of family and society. They are truly the way for all people. The material order by itself is not enough. It must be completed and enriched by the supernatural order. Thanks to this, life takes on a new meaning and man is made better. Life, in fact, needs the power that comes from divine, supernatural values; only then does it take on its full splendour.

Christ confirmed this law of the Old Covenant. In the Sermon on the Mount He spoke clearly to His hearers: "Think not that I have come to abolish the law and the prophets; I have come not to abolish them but to fulfil them" (Mt 5:17). Christ came to fulfil the law, above all to give it its proper content and meaning, and to show its full significance and depth: the law is perfect when it is pervaded by love of God and love of neighbour. It is love that determines man's moral perfection and his likeness to God. "He who has My commandments and keeps them", says Christ, "he it is who loves Me; and he who loves Me will be loved by My Father, and I will love him and manifest Myself to him" (Jn 14:21). Today's liturgical celebration... reminds us of God's love, for which man yearns intensely. It shows us that the practical response to this love is the keeping of God's commandments in our daily lives. God does not intend that they should grow dim in our memory but that they should remain forever impressed on people's consciences so that, knowing and keeping the commandments, they "might have eternal life".

"Happy are they who practise righteousness." The Psalmist refers thus to those who follow the path of the commandments and keep them to the end (cf. Ps 119:32-33). Keeping the divine law, in fact, is the basis for obtaining the gift of eternal life, that is, the happiness that never ends. To the question of the rich young man, "Teacher, what good deed must I do to have eternal life?" (Mt 19:16), Jesus responds: "If you would enter life, keep the commandments" (Mt 19:17). This response by Jesus is particularly important in our modern reality, in which many people live as though there were no God. temptation to organize the world and one's own life without God or even in opposition to God, without His commandments and without the Gospel, is a very real temptation and threatens us too. When human life and the world are built without God, they will eventually turn against man himself. Breaking the divine commandments, abandoning the path traced out for us by God, means falling into the slavery of sin,

and "the wages of sin is death" (*Rom* 6:23). We find ourselves face to face with the reality of sin. Sin is an offence against God, it is being disobedient to Him, to His law, to the moral norms which God has given to man, inscribing them on the human heart, confirming and perfecting them by Revelation. Sin pits itself against God's love for us and turns our hearts away from Him. Sin is "love of self carried to the point of contempt for God," as Saint Augustine put it (*De Civitate Dei*, 14, 28). Sin is a great evil in all its many dimensions. Starting with original sin, to the personal sins committed by each person, to social sins, the sins which weigh heavily on the history of the entire human family.

We must be constantly aware of this great evil, we must constantly cultivate the subtle sensitivity and clear consciousness of the seeds of death contained in sin. This is what is commonly known as the sense of sin. Its source is to be found in man's moral conscience; it is linked to the knowledge of God, to the experience of union with the Creator, Lord and Father. The more profound this awareness of union with God-strengthened by a person's sacramental life and by sincere prayer - the clearer the sense of sin is. The reality of God lays open and sheds light on the mystery of man. We must do all that we can to make our consciences more sensitive, and to guard them from becoming deformed or imperceptive.

We see what great tasks God has put before us. We must truly form our humanity in the image and likeness of God, to become people who love the law of God and want to live according to it. The Psalmist cries out: "Have mercy on me, O God, according to Your steadfast love; according to Your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions. Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin" (*Ps* 51:1-2). Is this not for us a touching example of the man who presents himself repentant before God? He desires *metanoia* for his own heart, so that he may become a new creature, different, transformed by God's power....

Dear Brothers and Sisters, let us contemplate the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which is the source of life, since by means of it victory over death was achieved. It is also the source of holiness, since in it sin - the enemy of man's spiritual development - is defeated. The Heart of the Lord Jesus is the starting point of the holiness of each one of us. From the Heart of the Lord Jesus let us learn the love of God and understanding of the mystery of sin — *mysterium iniquitatis*. Let us make acts of reparation to the Divine Heart for the sins committed by us and by our fellow men. Let us make reparation for rejecting God's goodness and love.

"Ma in qual modo – voi mi chiederete – Gesù Cristo non ha abrogato la legge? In qual modo ha dato compimento alla legge e ai profeti? Per quanto riguarda i profeti, egli ha confermato con le opere tutto quanto essi avevano predetto di lui; perciò l'evangelista sempre dice: "Affinché si adempisse ciò che fu detto dai profeti". Quando nacque, quando i fanciulli gli cantarono un meraviglioso inno, quando montò sopra un asina, e in una infinità di altre circostanze, egli compì le profezie, che non si sarebbero mai realizzate se egli non fosse venuto al mondo. E per quanto, invece, concerne la legge, egli le dà compimento non in un sol modo, né in due, ma in tre maniere. Prima di tutto, perché egli non ha trasgredito nessuna delle prescrizioni legali. Che egli, infatti, le abbia adempiute tutte testimoniano le sue parole a Giovanni: È conveniente che adempiamo così ogni giustizia (Mt 3, 15); ai Giudei: *Chi di voi mi può accusare di peccato?* (Gv 8, 46) e infine, ai discepoli: *Il principe del mondo* sta per venire; veramente non ha nulla in me (Gv 14, 30). ... La seconda consiste nel fatto che egli la compì per noi. Infatti ciò che vi è di particolarmente ammirabile nel suo comportamento, non è solo il fatto che egli abbia adempito la legge, ma il fatto che ha dato la grazia perché anche noi la adempiamo. Proprio questo rileva Paolo con le parole: Poiché il termine della legge è Cristo a giustificazione di ogni credente (Rm 10, 17). ... Siccome in realtà la legge tendeva a rendere l'uomo giusto, ma non aveva sufficiente forza per realizzare questo scopo, Gesù Cristo venne egli stesso per introdurre nel mondo un mezzo efficace di giustificazione, la fede, e realizzò così quanto la legge voleva fare; ciò che la lettera della legge non era stata capace di compiere, egli compì per mezzo della fede. E, in questo senso, dice di non essere venuto per abrogare la legge. Se qualcuno indagasse attentamente, scoprirebbe anche il terzo modo in cui Cristo ha adempito l'antica legge: questo egli l'ha fatto mediante i precetti che stava per dare. Infatti, tutto quanto Gesù Cristo dice nel Vangelo non mira affatto ad abrogare, ma piuttosto ad estendere e a completare l'antica legge. Tanto per citare un esempio, l'antico comandamento di non uccidere, non soltanto non è abrogato, ma è perfezionato e tanto più rafforzato da quanto egli dice, cioè che non si deve mai cedere all'ira. E la stessa cosa si può notare a proposito di tutti gli altri comandamenti. (San Giovanni Crisostomo, Commento al Vangelo di S. Matteo, 16, 2-3).
