PARABLE OF THE SOWER

The reading of the Gospel of Saint Matthew makes us think back to the parable of the sower. We know the parable, but we can re-read the words of the Gospel over and over again and still find new light. So the sower comes out to sow. As he sows, some seeds fall on the path, some on rocky ground, some among thorns, some finally on good soil, and only these last gave fruit (cf. Mt 13:3-8).

Jesus did not limit Himself to presenting us with a parable, He explained it. Let us hear then the explanation of the parable of the sower. The seeds that fell on the path represent those who hear the word of the Kingdom of God but do not understand it. The Evil One comes and takes away what has been sown in their hearts (cf. Mt 13:19). The Evil One often uses this tactic and he tries to prevent the seed from germinating in people's hearts. This is the first comparison. The second is the seed fallen on rocky ground. This ground represents the people who hear the word and welcome it immediately with joy, but they do not have roots in them and are inconstant. When tribulation or persecution comes because of the word, they fall away immediately (cf. Mt 13:20-21). What psychological insight in this comparison made by Christ! We know well from our experience and the experience of others the inconstancy of people deprived of the roots which would enable the word to grow! The third case is the seed fallen among thorns. Christ explains that he is thinking of those who hear the word but who, because of the worries of the world and their attachment to riches, stifle the word so that it does not bear fruit (cf. Mt 13:22).

Finally, the seed fallen on fertile ground represents those who hear the word and understand it, and the word bears fruit in them (cf. Mt 13:23). All of this magnificent parable speaks to us today as it spoke to the listeners of Jesus two thousand years ago.... Let us become the fertile ground which receives the Gospel and bears fruit!

Bearing in mind that the human soul hesitates to welcome the word of God, let us address the Spirit with this ardent liturgical prayer:

Veni Creator Spiritus
Mentes tuorum visitas,
Imple superna gratia,
Quae tu creasti pectora.
Come, O Creator Spirit,
Visit the souls of those who belong to you;
Fill with your grace from on high
The hearts which you have made.

In this prayer we open our hearts, imploring the Spirit to fill them with light and life.

Monday, July 11th, St. Benedict, Abbot. St. Benedict was born in Nursia, Italy about the year 480. He was educated in Rome and began to live as a hermit for Subiaco where he gathered disciples and then departed for Monte Cassino where he established the famous monastery and composed the Benedictine Rule. He died in 547.

Friday, July 15th, St. Bonaventure, Bishop, Doctor St. Bonaventure was born about the year 1218 in Tuscany, Italy. He was one of the first teachers in the newly founded Franciscan Order. He wrote extensively in the field of philosophy and theology. He died in 1274.

Saturday, July 16th, Our Lady of Mt. Carmel. Amid the many persecutions raised against the Order of Mount Carmel, newly arrived in Europe, St. Simon Stock, General of the Order, turned with filial confidence to the Blessed Mother of God. As he knelt in prayer on July 16, 1251, She appeared before him and presented him with the well-known brown scapular. It was given as an assurance for all who died wearing it of Her heavenly protection from eternal death. An extraordinary promise indeed, but one requiring a life of prayer and sacrifice.
