THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

The Gospel of the Third Sunday of Easter, which we have just heard, presents the episode of the disciples of Emmaus (cf. Lk 24:13-35), an account that never ceases to astonish and move us. This episode shows the effects that the Risen Jesus works in two disciples: conversion from despair to hope; conversion from sorrow to joy; and also conversion to community life. Sometimes, when we speak of conversion we think solely of its demanding aspect of detachment and renunciation. Christian conversion, on the contrary, is also and above all about joy, hope and love. It is always the work of the Risen Christ, the Lord of life who has obtained this grace for us through His Passion and communicates it to us by virtue of His Resurrection....

It is thus necessary for each and every one of us to let ourselves be taught by Jesus, as the two disciples of Emmaus were: first of all by listening to and loving the word of God read in the light of the Paschal Mystery, so that it may warm our hearts and illumine our minds helping us to interpret the events of life and give them meaning. Then it is necessary to sit at table with the Lord, to share the banquet with him, so that His humble presence in the Sacrament of His Body and Blood may restore to us the gaze of faith, in order to see everything and everyone with God's eyes, in the light of His love. Staying with Jesus Who has stayed with us, assimilating His lifestyle, choosing with Him the logic of communion with each other, of solidarity and of sharing. The Eucharist is the maximum expression of the gift which Jesus makes of Himself and is a constant invitation to live our lives in the Eucharistic logic, as a gift to God and to others.

The Gospel also mentions that after recognizing Jesus in the breaking of the bread, the two disciples "rose that same hour and returned to Jerusalem" (Lk 24:33). They felt the need to return to Jerusalem and to tell of their extraordinary experience: the encounter with the Risen Lord. A great effort must be made so that every Christian.... in every other part of the world, may be transformed into a witness, ready to proclaim vigorously and joyfully the event of Christ's death and Resurrection....

Even a traditionally Catholic people can feel negatively or assimilate almost unconsciously the repercussions of a culture that ends by insinuating a mentality in which the Gospel message is openly rejected or subtly hindered. I know that you have made and are making a considerable effort to defend the eternal values of the Christian faith. I encourage you never to give in to the recurring temptations of the hedonistic culture and to the appeal of materialistic consumerism. Accept the invitation of the Apostle Peter, contained in today's Second Reading, to conduct yourselves "with fear throughout the time of your exile" here below (1 Pt 1:17); an invitation that is put into practice by living intensely on the thoroughfares of our world in the awareness of the destination to be reached: unity with God, in the Crucified and Risen Christ.

In fact, our faith and our hope are addressed to God (cf. 1 Pt 1:21): they are addressed to God because they are rooted in Him, founded on His love and on His fidelity. In past centuries, your Churches knew a rich tradition of holiness and of generous service to the brethren, thanks to the work of zealous priests and men and women religious of both active and contemplative life. If we wish to listen to their spiritual teaching it is not difficult for us to recognize the personal and unmistakable appeal that they address to us: *Be holy!* Make Christ the centre of your lives! Build the edifice of your existence on Him! In Jesus you will find the strength to open yourselves to others and to make yourselves, after His example, a gift for the whole of humanity.... This, brothers and sisters, is my hope, this is the prayer that I raise to God for all of you, Be confident: the Risen Lord is walking with you, yesterday, today and for ever. Amen.

3a di Pasqua – 4 maggio 2014

Il Signore Gesù, dopo essere risuscitato dai morti, trovò per via due dei suoi discepoli, che conversavano insieme dei fatti del giorno, e disse loro: "*Che sono questi discorsi che andate facendo tra di voi, e perché siete tristi?*", ecc.; il fatto è narrato dal solo evangelista Luca. Marco si limita a dire che apparve a due discepoli lungo la via ([Mc 16,12](#) [Mc 16,13](#)): ma quel che essi dissero al Signore, od anche ciò che questi disse loro, egli lo ha tralasciato. "*Cristo con i discepoli per via*". Cosa dunque ci ha apportato questa lezione? Qualcosa di grande, se cerchiamo di comprendere. Gesù apparve: era visto con gli occhi, ma non era riconosciuto. Il Maestro camminava con loro per via, anzi era lui stesso la via: essi però non camminavano ancora per la via; li trovò bensì che esorbitavano dalla via. Quando infatti era stato con loro, prima della sua Passione, aveva loro tutto predetto: che avrebbe patito, che sarebbe morto e risuscitato il terzo giorno ([Mt 20,18-19](#)): tutto aveva predetto; ma la morte di lui fu oblio per loro. Così rimasero turbati quando lo videro pendente dal

legno, sì da dimenticare il docente, da non aspettare il risorgente, né da tener fede all'autore delle promesse. "*Noi*", dicono essi, "*speravamo che avrebbe operato la redenzione d'Israele*". O discepoli, voi speravate; dunque ora non sperate più? Ecco che Cristo vive, mentre la speranza è morta in voi! Certamente Cristo vive. E Cristo vivo trovò morti i cuori dei discepoli: ai loro occhi apparve e non apparve; ed era visto e si nascondeva. Ma se non era visto, in qual modo lo ascoltavano mentre interrogava, o rispondevano alle sue domande? Egli viaggiava per via con loro come un compagno, mentre era il capo medesimo. Senza altro lo vedevano, però non lo riconoscevano. "*I loro occhi erano infatti appesantiti e incapaci di riconoscerlo*", come abbiamo sentito. Non dice che erano incapaci di vedere, bensì che *erano incapaci di riconoscerlo*. "Perché Cristo volle essere riconosciuto nella frazione del pane. Il premio dell'ospitalità". Orsù, fratelli, dove volle essere riconosciuto il Signore? Nella frazione del pane. Siamone certi, spezziamo il pane, e conosciamo il Signore. Non ha voluto essere conosciuto se non lì; il che vale per noi che non eravamo destinati a vederlo nella carne, e tuttavia avremmo mangiato la sua carne. Perciò, chiunque tu sia, o fedele; chiunque tu sia che non vuoi essere detto vanamente cristiano; chiunque tu sia che non senza ragione entri in chiesa; chiunque tu sia che ascolti con timore e speranza la parola di Dio, ti consoli la frazione del pane. L'assenza del Signore non è assenza: abbi fede, ed è con te colui che non vedi. Quei tali, quando parlava con loro il Signore, non avevano fede: perché non credevano che fosse risorto, non speravano che potesse risorgere. Avevano perduto la fede, avevano perduto la speranza. Camminavano morti in compagnia della stessa vita. Con loro camminava la vita, ma nei loro cuori la vita non era stata ancora richiamata. Anche tu, quindi, se vuoi avere la vita, fa' ciò che essi fecero, affinché tu conosca il Signore. Essi gli dettero ospitalità. Il Signore era infatti simile ad uno che vuole andare oltre, essi però lo trattennero. E dopo esser giunti al luogo cui erano diretti, dissero: "*Resta ancora qui con noi, si fa sera infatti e il giorno volge al declino*". Accogli l'ospite, se vuoi conoscere il Salvatore. Ciò che aveva portato via l'infedeltà, lo restituì l'ospitalità. Il Signore, dunque, si fece conoscere nella frazione del pane. Imparate dove cercare il Signore, imparate dove possedere, dove conoscere, quando mangiate. I fedeli infatti hanno conosciuto in questa lezione qualcosa che meglio comprendiamo e che quei tali non conobbero. "*Cristo si è assentato con il corpo perché si edificasse la fede*". Il Signore è stato conosciuto; e dopo essere stato conosciuto, mai più ricomparve. Si separò da loro con il corpo, colui che era trattenuto dalla fede. Per questo infatti il Signore si assentò con il corpo da tutta la Chiesa, e ascese al cielo, perché si edificasse la fede. Se infatti non conosci se non ciò che vedi, dove sta la fede? Ma se credi anche ciò che non vedi, godrai quando vedrai. Si edifica la fede, perché si respinge l'apparenza. Verrà ciò che non vediamo; verrà, fratelli, verrà: ma, attento a come ti troverà. Infatti, verrà ciò che dicono gli uomini: Dove, quando, come, quando sarà, quando verrà? Sta' certo, verrà: e non soltanto verrà, ma verrà anche se tu non vuoi.
