THE ROMAN MISSAL

Did you know that the English translation of the Mass which we currently use is going to change? Until the early 1960s, Mass was celebrated in Latin throughout the world. At the Second Vatican Council it was agreed that the Mass could be celebrated in our own language, and in 1970 Pope Paul VI approved the official Latin text that would be used. This was then translated into different languages to be used throughout the world. It proved to be a huge task which was completed in a very short time. However, because it was done so quickly, some of the richness of the original Latin prayers was, quite literally, 'lost in translation'. It was agreed that a further translation was necessary.

On Nov. 27, 2011, churches throughout the world will begin to use a new English translation. You will notice many changes in the words that the celebrant (priest) uses when he celebrates Mass. There are also a few changes to the words that the congregation will use when they respond, also referred to as the "people's parts". We will also introduce new musical compositions as part of the sung Mass settings (Lord of Mercy, Gloria, Holy Holy, Lamb of God, etc.). The new translation would keep the original words, meaning and style of the Latin as far as possible. The new translation also means a new edition of the Missal which will include some additional text such as, prayers for the saints who have been added by the Church to the liturgical calendar.

The Second Vatican Council reminded us of our ancient faith: Christ is always present in His church, especially in its liturgical celebrations. So, each time we come to Mass we experience the presence of Christ in four different ways:

1. Christ is present in the congregation – the people gathered together;
2. Christ is present in the person of the priest;
3. Christ is present in the Scriptures that we listen to during Mass;
4. Christ is present in the bread and wine when it becomes Christ's Body and Blood.

The more we are able to understand and participate in the Mass, the more we will come to appreciate and love it. The new translation will help us to do that because the words we will now use will say more clearly what our faith is teaching us. THE SACRED LITURGY THIS WEEK

Tuesday, Sept. 20th, St. Andrew Kim Taegon, Priest, Paul Chong Hasang & Companions, Martyrs are Korean martyrs who suffered for the Faith in the nineteenth century. We pray for the Church in Korea and especially for the people of North Korea.

Wednesday, September 21st, St. Matthew, Apostle, Evangelist. The account of Matthew's conversion from a life of sin as a publican contains the invitation that Jesus wishes to each of His followers: "Follow Me." His gospel, considered the first to have been written, was the favourite Gospel of the early Church

Friday, September 23rd, St. Pio of Pietrelcina, Priest. Padre Pio was born Francesco Forgione in Pietrelcina, Italy on May 25, 1887. At a very young age, he dedicated his life to God. He was ordained in the year 1910 and lived most of his life as a Capuchin friar in San Giovanni Rotondo. He became famous for his piety and for the visible wounds of Christ on his body. He died in 1968.
