Dear Brothers and Sisters, ... Telling the Parable of the dishonest but very crafty administrator, Christ teaches His disciples the best way to use money and material riches, that is, to share them with the poor, thus acquiring their friendship, with a view to the Kingdom of Heaven. "Make friends for yourselves by means of unrighteous mammon," Jesus says, "so that when it fails they may receive you into the eternal habitations" (Lk 16: 9). Money is not "dishonest" in itself, but more than anything else it can close man in a blind egocentrism. It therefore concerns a type of work of "conversion" of economic goods: instead of using them only for self-interest, it is also necessary to think of the needs of the poor, imitating Christ Himself, who, as St Paul wrote: "though He was rich, yet for your sake He became poor, so that by His poverty you might become rich" (II Cor 8: 9).

It seems paradoxical: Christ has not enriched us with His richness but with His poverty, with His love that brought Him to give Himself totally to us. Here one could open up a vast and complex field of reflection on the theme of poverty and riches, also on a world scale, in which two logics of economics oppose each other: the logic of profit and that of the equal distribution of goods, which do not contradict each other if their relationship is well ordered....

May Mary Most Holy, who in the *Magnificat* proclaimed: the Lord "has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich He has sent empty away" (Lk 1: 53), help Christians to use earthly goods with Gospel wisdom, that is, with generous solidarity, and inspire politicians and economists with farsighted strategies that favour the authentic progress of all peoples.

THE SACRED LITURGY THIS WEEK

Monday, September 23rd, St. Pio of Pietrelcina, Priest. Padre Pio was born Francesco Forgione in Pietrelcina, Italy on May 25, 1887. At a very young age, he dedicated his life to God. He was ordained in the year 1910 and lived most of his life as a Capuchin friar in San Giovanni Rotondo. He became famous for his piety and for the visible wounds of Christ on his body. He died in 1968.

Thursday, Sept. 26th, St. Jean de Brebeuf, St. Isaac Jogues, Priests & Companions, Martyrs. St. Isaac Jogues & Companions were the first North American martyrs officially recognized by the Church. They suffered greatly for the Church & the Faith in the 1600's.

Friday, Sept. 27th, St. Vincent de Paul, Priest. St. Vincent de Paul was born in France in 1581. After ordination to the priesthood, he served in a parish in Paris. Moved by the plight of the poor, he founded the Congregation of the Mission to supervise the formation of priests & to give support to the poor. With St. Louise de Marillac, he founded the congregation of the Daughters of Charity. He died in 1661.

FRIDAY EXPOSITION OF THE MOST BLESSED SACRAMENT begins at 3:00 p.m. with the praying of the Divine Mercy Chaplet. **Eucharistic Holy Hour will begin at 6:00 p.m.** with Devotions to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and end with Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament. Holy Mass begins at 7:00 p.m. In order for the Blessed Sacrament to be exposed at least two adorers should be present in the Church at all times.

SACRED HEART DEVOTION

Devotion to the Sacred Heart, as we know it, began about the year 1672. On repeated occasions, Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, a Visitation nun, in France, and during these apparitions He explained to her the devotion to His Sacred Heart as He wanted people to practice it. He asked to be honored in the symbol of His Heart of flesh; He asked for acts of reparation, for frequent Communion, Communion on the First Friday of the month, and the keeping of the Holy Hour. When the Catholic Church approved the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, she did not base her action only on the visions of St. Margaret Mary. The Church approved the devotion on its own merits. There is only one Person in Jesus, and that Person was at the same time God and Man. His Heart, too, is Divine -- it is the Heart of God.

There are two things that must always be found together in the devotion to the Sacred Heart: Christ's love of flesh and Christ's love for us. True devotion to the Sacred Heart means devotion to the Divine Heart of Christ insofar as His Heart represents and recalls His love for us.

In honoring the Heart of Christ, our homage lingers on the Person of Jesus in the fullness of His love. This love of Christ for us was the moving force of all he did and suffered for us -- in Nazareth, on the Cross, in giving Himself in the Blessed Sacrament, in His teaching and healing, in His praying and working. When we speak of the Sacred Heart, we mean Jesus showing us His Heart, Jesus all love for us and all lovable. *(Taken from EWTN: <http://www.ewtn.com/devotionals/heart/meditation.htm#ixzz2fMNvgDoo>)*

Possibile che l'uomo sappia escogitare le vie più nascoste quando si tratta di far soldi o ottenere successo e che sia invece così imbranato, così fiacco, quando si tratta di conquistare il Regno di Dio (Sirboni-Monari, *Lampada per i miei passi-C* p. 266).
