Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In this Sunday's Gospel, for the second time Jesus proclaims His passion, death & Resurrection to the disciples (cf. *Mk 9:30-31*). The Evangelist Mark highlights the strong contrast between his mindset and that of the Twelve Apostles, who not only do not understand the Teacher's words and clearly reject the idea that He is doomed to encounter death (cf. *Mk 8:32*), but also discuss which of them is to be considered "the greatest" (*Mk 9:34*). Jesus patiently explains His logic to them, the logic of love that makes itself service to the point of the gift of self: "If anyone would be first, he must be last of all and servant of all" (*Mk 9:35*).

This is the logic of Christianity, which responds to the truth about man created in the image of God, but at the same time contrasts with human selfishness, a consequence of original sin. Every human person is attracted by love - which ultimately is God Himself - but often errs in the concrete ways of loving; thus, an originally positive tendency but one polluted by sin can give rise to evil intentions and actions.

In today's Liturgy, this is also recalled in the Letter of St James: "Wherever jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there will be disorder and every vile practice. But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, open to reason, full of mercy and good fruits, without uncertainty or insincerity". And the Apostle concludes: "The harvest of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace" (*Jas 3:16-18*). These words call to mind the witness of so many Christians who humbly and silently spend their lives serving others for the sake of the Lord Jesus, behaving in practice as servants of love, and hence, "artisans" of peace.... There is no doubt that following Christ is difficult, but, as He says, only those who lose their life for His sake and the Gospel's will save it (cf. *Mk 8:35*), giving full meaning to their existence. There is no other way of being His disciples, there is no other way of witnessing to His love and striving for Gospel perfection. May Mary, whom we call upon today as Our Lady of Mercy, open our hearts ever wider to the love of God, a mystery of joy and holiness.

**SACRED LITURGY THIS WEEK**

**Wed., Sept. 26<sup>th</sup>, St. Jean de Brebeuf, St. Isaac Jogues, Priests & Companions, Martyrs.** St. Isaac Jogues and Companions were the first North American martyrs officially recognized by the Church. They suffered greatly for the Church and the Faith in the 1600's.

**Thursday, Sept. 27<sup>th</sup>, St. Vincent de Paul, Priest.** St. Vincent de Paul was born in France in 1581. After ordination to the priesthood, he served in a parish in Paris. Moved by the plight of the poor, he founded the Congregation of the Mission to supervise the formation of priests and to give support to the poor. With St. Louise de Marillac, he also founded the congregation of the Daughters of Charity. He died in 1661.

**Saturday, September 29<sup>th</sup>, St. Michael, St. Gabriel, and St. Raphael, Archangels.** We celebrate the ministry of these angels to whom God has entrusted particular tasks in the Mystery of Salvation.

**OUR LADY'S PSALTER: The Rosary of the Mystery of Christ, A More Ancient Way of Praying the Rosary by Fr. Marco Testa** is available at the Parish Office. This volume, reminiscent of the Little Office of the Blessed Virgin Mary, contains the oldest rosary clausulae in Latin and their English counterparts. It brings together different traditional elements of a prayer that over centuries has evolved and which continues to form the faithful in the Gospel. This ancient form of the Rosary is eminently suited to the observance of the Year of Faith.

**THE BRIGITTINE ROSARY** The Briggittine (or "Saint Bridget") Rosary which the Discalced Carmelites adopted as their habit rosary looks similar to a regular Rosary, but with an extra decade. The resultant seven *Pater* beads honor the Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the sixty-three *Ave Maria* beads commemorate the sixty-three years it is believed the Blessed Mother lived on earth before her Assumption. In praying the Briggittine Rosary, there are a total of eighteen decades: In the six Joyful Mysteries, the first is the Immaculate Conception; the sixth of the Sorrowful Mysteries commemorates when the Body of the Lord was placed in the Arms of His Sorrowful Mother; and the sixth of the Glorious Mysteries is recited in honor of the Patronage of Mary, Mediatrix of All Grace (and, for the Carmelite, Mary, Queen and Beauty of Carmel). The other mysteries are the same as in the Dominican Rosary. The Briggittine Rosary is available for purchase in the Parish Office.

"Tutta la pratica della sapienza cristiana non consiste né in abbondanza di parole, né in abilità nel discutere, né in appetiti di lode e di gloria, bensì nella sincera e volontaria umiltà che il Signore Gesù Cristo ha scelto e insegnato con ogni mezzo, dal seno materno fino al supplizio della croce. Cristo ama l'infanzia e verso di lei orienta il modo di agire degli adulti; verso di lei riconduce gli anziani; egli attrae al suo esempio personale coloro che egli innalza al regno eterno. Se però vogliamo divenire capaci di capire come sia possibile pervenire ad una conversione così mirabile, e per quali trasformazioni si debba ritornare allo stato d'infanzia, lasciamo che sia san Paolo a istruirci, con le parole: *Non siate come bambini nel modo di giudicare, siate invece bambini in fatto di malizia* (1 Cor 14,20). Non si tratta perciò di tornare alle goffaggini degli inizi, bensì di riprendere da essa una cosa che si addice benissimo anche agli anni della maturità, cioè che svanisce senza indugi le nostre agitazioni interiori e che ritroviamo rapidamente la pace; che non serbiamo ricordo delle offese; che non siamo minimamente avidi di dignità; che amiamo stare insieme serbandone un'uguaglianza secondo natura (Leone Magno, *Sermone VII*)."

"Dio si lascia cacciare fuori del mondo sulla croce, Dio è impotente e debole nel mondo e appunto solo così egli ci sta a fianco e ci aiuta. È assolutamente evidente in Matteo 8.17 (*Perché si adempisse ciò che era stato detto per mezzo del profeta Isaia: egli ha preso le nostre infermità...*) che Cristo non aiuta in forza della sua onnipotenza, ma in forza della sua debolezza, della sua sofferenza! Qui sta la differenza decisiva rispetto a qualsiasi religione. La religiosità umana rinvia l'uomo nella sua tribolazione alla potenza di Dio nel mondo... La Bibbia rinvia l'uomo all'impotenza e alla sofferenza di Dio: solo il Dio sofferente può aiutare. In questo senso si può dire che l'evoluzione verso la 'maggiore età' del mondo, con la quale si fa piazza pulita di una falsa immagine di Dio, apra lo sguardo verso il Dio della Bibbia, che ottiene potenza e spazio nel mondo grazie alla sua impotenza (D. Bonhoeffer, *Resistenza e resa*, 324)."

"L'intima natura della Chiesa si esprime in un triplice compito: annuncio della Parola di Dio (*kerygma-martyria*), celebrazione dei Sacramenti (*leiturgia*), servizio della carità (*diakonia*). Sono compiti che si presuppongono a vicenda e non possono essere separati l'uno dall'altro. La carità non è per la Chiesa una specie di attività di assistenza sociale che si potrebbe anche lasciare ad altri, ma appartiene alla sua natura, è espressione irrinunciabile della sua stessa essenza (Benedetto XVI, *Deus caritas est*, 53-54)."
