SAINTS HERE AND HEREAFTER

November 1st, we celebrate the *Feast of All Saints* and November 2^{nd} , we commemorate all the *souls in purgatory*. By celebrating these two liturgies, we are giving expression to our belief in the communion of saints, words that we say in the Creed.

The *communion of saints* means, simply, the common union of those souls who were sanctified when they received the sacrament of Baptism. And if sanctified, they were saints, and still are saints, if in the friendship of God. Hence, all the souls on earth, in heaven, and in purgatory, if not separated from God by serious sin, are the saints mentioned in the words "communion of saints." There is a common bond between us; we can communicate with each other; we can pray for and to one another, that a merciful God will one day receive all of us in His heavenly kingdom.

The members of the Church, of which Christ is the Head, can be put into one of three categories. Those of us who are still in the world - and still confronted with spiritual uprising in the world, of the flesh and of the devil - are in the Church Militant or the Pilgrim Church. We are being tested or tried on the battlefield of this earthly life, hoping that one day we shall win the crown of victory.

Those who have gained the victory are now in heaven. They are reaping the rewards of a good life on earth. They are enjoying that eternal happiness which only God can give. They belong to the Church Triumphant. The third category consists of souls who were not bad enough for hell, not good enough for heaven. When they left this world they had no serious sin on their souls which would have condemned them to hell. At the same time, they did have slight sins, or slight imperfections which kept them out of heaven until they perfect themselves. Heaven, which is a place of perfection. Souls go to heaven when there are no blemishes whatsoever on them. Hence, those souls who, according to the justice of God, are not meant for hell or ready for heaven, must be found in a place where they can do something in the line of suffering in order to be purged of those imperfections. It's a place to be purged – we call it purgatory. And the souls who go there belong to the Church Suffering.

The saints in heaven can help us who are still struggling on earth. They are our friends, our advocates who can, and do, plead our cause before the throne of God. They do not grant us favours directly; they ask God to help us, because all good things come from God alone and so let us always ask their intercessions.
