Pope Francis Prayer Intentions for April 2017 Young People

I WILL RAISE YOU FROM YOUR GRAVES

Our April journey to Easter begins with the promise made to Israel through Ezekiel, in the vision of the valley of dry bones: "*I will raise you from your graves*." The vision granted to Ezekiel is the first time that the resurrection from the dead, God's final and total overcoming of the power of death and the injustice and hatred that flow from it, is made to Israel. In John's gospel, Jesus raises Lazarus from his grave as the last of his signs, to show that the promise made through Ezekiel is about to be fulfilled.

But the resurrection comes in an unexpected way, as Palm Sunday reminds us: Jesus chooses to enter Jerusalem on a donkey: he will be the king promised by the prophet Zechariah, "*humble and riding on a donkey*." Paul picks up this theme in his celebration of Jesus' total gift of himself in his self-emptying on the cross, and Matthew affirms, in a sentence that is often overlooked, that the moment of Jesus' death on the cross is the very moment when "the tombs also were opened, and many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised." When the Roman troops see "the earthquake and what took place" they testify that "truly this man was God's Son!"

The celebrations of Holy Week and the Triduum invite us to enter more deeply into this Passover journey through death to fullness of Life, to follow Christ along this way of passion, death and resurrection step by step.
