<u>The Sacred Paschal Triduum</u> Through his Paschal Mystery, the Lord Jesus redeemed the

human race and gave perfect glory to the Father. By dying, Christ destroyed our death; by rising, he restored our life. For this reason, the Easter Triduum, when we celebrate the suffering, death and resurrection of our Lord, is the high point of the Liturgical Year. The Easter Solemnity is to the year what Sunday is to the week.

The celebration of the Easter Triduum opens with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, reaches its climax in the Easter Vigil, and closes with Evening Prayer II on Easter Sunday.

Living the Gospel by supporting the Deaf community Taavi wasn't engaged at his school or in extracurricular sports and as a Deaf person, he faced obstacles trying to join his hearing peers. His mom encouraged him to try to participate in the Deaf community. His life changed when he joined a Deaf basketball fun day hosted by Silent Voice and met Mike, Director of the Silent Voice Child and Family Program. He joined a Deaf sports team, began a co-op position with Silent Voice in his 4th year of high school, and was hired as a counselor in the Silent Voice Sign Language Summer day camp. He continues to volunteer at Silent Voice and says, "*Tm grateful to ShareLife – supported Silent Voice and want to be a role model for Deaf kids, like Mike was to me.*" Last year more than 600 deaf children received help through ShareLife-supported Silent Voice's Sign Language

GOOD FRIDAY REFLECTION

...Jesus will lead us to Calvary and to the glory of Easter morning, but only if we take up our cross and follow...

On Good Friday ... You will be invited up to adore the wood of the cross on which hung our salvation. Do not approach empty handed - for that would be a terrible waste. Take your own cross with your pains and burdens ... Bring your sins to the cross and leave them there with Him – those committed long ago and those of yesterday. Place them on His cross. Take with you your confusion, hurts, resentment and anger - give it to Him. Bring your fears, your illness, all your maladies, grab hold of them and give them to the man of sorrows ...Come forward and touch the cross, embrace it, kiss it – place your hurts there; The times when family hurt you, when friends betrayed you, when those around you were rude or hurtful. Take these pains and leave them with Jesus. Don't miss this opportunity to encounter Jesus to experience his love and divine mercy. For the total self-giving of Christ on the cross is also an invitation for each of us to give ourselves to God...

The Cross expresses a love more powerful than sin and death. It is in fact God's most powerful condescension, a touch of eternal love on our wounds.
