THE SACRED LITURGY THIS WEEK

Wednesday, Jan. 21, <u>St Agnes</u> was highly regarded by the early Christian Church. According to tradition, Agnes was a Christian girl of Rome, who decided to dedicate herself to the Lord and remain unmarried. When she refused to marry the governor's son, he accused her of being a Christian in the time of the Diocletian persecutions. In spite, she was sent to a house of prostitution then condemned to death by either fire or sword.

Friday, Jan 24, <u>Francis de Sales</u> was born in France in 1567 and ordained a priest in 1593 during a time of great religious and political struggles in Europe. He had great success persuading people to return or convert to the Catholic faith. His motto was, "He who preaches with love, preaches effectively." Francis died at Lyons 29 December 1622.

ON THE UNITY OF THE CHURCH

The unicity of the Church founded by him must be firmly believed as a truth of Catholic faith. Just as there is one Christ, so there exists a single body of Christ, a single Bride of Christ: "a single Catholic and apostolic Church". Furthermore, the promises of the Lord that he would not abandon his Church (cf. Mt 16:18; 28:20) and that he would guide her by his Spirit (cf. Jn 16:13) mean, according to Catholic faith, that the unicity and the unity of the Church — like everything that belongs to the Church's integrity will never be lacking.

The Catholic faithful are required to profess that there is an historical continuity — rooted in the apostolic succession — between the Church founded by Christ and the Catholic Church: "This is the single Church of Christ... which our Saviour, after his resurrection, entrusted to Peter's pastoral care (cf. Jn 21:17), commissioning him and the other Apostles to extend and rule her (cf. Mt 28:18ff.), erected for all ages as 'the pillar and mainstay of the truth' (1 Tim 3:15). This Church, constituted and organized as a society in the present world, subsists in the Catholic Church, governed by the Successor of Peter and by the Bishops in communion with him".

There exists a single Church of Christ, which subsists in the Catholic Church, governed by the Successor of Peter and by the Bishops in communion with him. "The Christian faithful are therefore not permitted to imagine that the Church of Christ is nothing more than a collection divided, yet in some way one - of Churches and ecclesial communities; nor are they free to hold that today the Church of Christ nowhere really exists, and must be considered only as a goal which all Churches and ecclesial communities must strive to reach". In fact, "the elements of this alreadygiven Church exist, joined together in their fullness in the Catholic Church and, without this fullness, in the other communities". "Therefore, these separated Churches and communities as such, though we believe they suffer from defects, have by no means been deprived of significance and importance in the mystery of salvation. For the spirit of Christ has not refrained from using them as means of salvation which derive their efficacy from the very fullness of grace and truth entrusted to the Catholic Church".

The lack of unity among Christians is certainly a wound for the Church; not in the sense that she is deprived of her unity, but "in that it hinders the complete fulfillment of her universality in history".

Excerpt from **Domine Iesus**. A declaration of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, which received approval from St. John Paul II in 2000, on the unicity and the salvificic universality of Jesus Christ and the Church.
