THE SACRED LITURGY THIS WEEK

Monday, Jan. 26, St. Timothy (d. 97?) a fellow apostle with Paul was with him at the founding of the Church in Corinth. He had a Greek father and a Jewish mother so was considered illegitimate by the Jews. It was his grandmother, Lois, who first became Christian. During the 15 years he worked with Paul, he became one of his most faithful and trusted friends who sent him on difficult often in the face of great disturbance in local churches which Paul had founded. St. Titus (d. 94?) was a close friend and disciple of Paul as well as a fellow missionary. Though Titus was a Gentile (Greek born), Paul would not let him be forced to undergo circumcision at Jerusalem. When Paul was having trouble with the community at Corinth, Titus was the bearer of Paul's severe letter and was successful in smoothing things out. The Letter to Titus addresses him as the administrator of the Christian community on the island of Crete, charged with correcting abuses & appointing presbyter-bishops.

Tues., Jan. 28 St. Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274 Patron of universities and students). Was one of the great teachers of the medieval Catholic Church. Born into a noble Naples family he was an exceptional student and joined the Franciscans in 1243 despite the severe opposition of his family. He taught in many European Universities and is the preeminent spokesman of the Catholic tradition of reason and of divine revelation.

Fri., Jan 31, St. John Bosco (1815-1888 Patron Saint of Editors and Children). Throughout his life he had prophetic dreams; several of which inspired his ministry to the service of abandoned young people. He began his ministry to the young with free catechism classes after Sunday Mass which soon grew into a full-fledged school where boys could receive an education, learn a trade, and love Jesus. His teaching methods were based on love rather than punishment.

CONVERSION OF ST. PAUL

After the extraordinary event that occurred on the road to Damascus, Saul, who was zealous in his persecution of the nascent Church, was transformed into a tireless apostle of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

It is clear from what happened to this extraordinary evangelizer that his transformation was not the result of long inner reflection nor even the fruit of personal effort. It was first and foremost a work of the grace of God who acted in his own inscrutable ways. This explains why, in writing to the community of Corinth a few years after his conversion, St Paul affirms "by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain" (1 Cor 15:10).

In addition, in considering attentively what happened to St Paul, one understands that the transformation he experienced in his life is not limited to the ethical level - such as conversion from immorality to morality - nor to the intellectual level - such as a change in his way of understanding reality — but, rather, is a matter of the radical renewal of his being, similar in many aspects to a rebirth. This transformation is founded on participation in the mystery of the death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ and is described as a gradual process of conformation to him. In the light of this awareness, when St Paul was subsequently called to defend the legitimacy of his apostolic vocation and of the Gospel he proclaimed, he was to say: "I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me; and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me" (Gal 2:20).

St Paul's personal experience enables him to expect with well-founded hope the fulfilment of this mystery of transformation that will concern all who have believed in Jesus Christ, as well as all humanity and the whole of creation. St Paul, after developing a long case aimed at strengthening the hope of the Resurrection in the faithful, describes in a few lines, employing the traditional imagery of the apocalyptic literature of his time, the great day of the Last Judgement in which humanity's destiny will be fulfilled: "In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet... the dead will be raised imperishable, and we shall be changed" (1 Cor 15:52).
