

World Day Of Consecrated Life

The purpose of this day is to show esteem for consecrated life and praise God for this great gift, and also to promote religious vocations. Throughout history, to be consecrated has meant to be set apart for a special purpose. This often involves a ceremony and frequently anointing with oil.

This celebration is attached to the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on February 2nd also known as Candlemas Day - the day on which candles are blessed symbolizing Christ who is the light of the world.

The offering of Jesus to the Father in the Temple by Mary and Joseph, which we celebrate with the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, "*expresses very well the figure of the Church who continues to offer her sons and daughters to the heavenly Father*," and thus is a fitting time to observe the World Day for Consecrated Life, said Saint John Paul II in his message for the first such occasion in 1997.

OBERAMMERGAU PASSION PLAY 2020

During the last outbreak of the Back Plague in Bavaria, the inhabitants of a small village, not far out of Munich, made a Solemn Vow to God that if their community was spared from the plague they would, every 10 years, perform a Passion play. Having been spared from the plague, the community of Oberammergau has since 1634 been faithful to that vow. Every 10 years, we are given the opportunity to participate in this extraordinary experience.

I had the chance to attend the Passion play for the first time in 2010, and I was amazed by the whole experience. First and foremost, it is the occasion for a deeply moving meditation on the Passion of the Lord. The text, music and the acting all contribute to spiritual experience. It is also fascinating to see how this community of around 5,000 inhabitants pull together to organize this event that brings people from around the globe to its doorstep. In order to participate in the play in any capacity – actor, choir, musician - you have to have been born in Oberammergau or have lived there for 20 years. It means that this is truly a community project and it fosters the creativity of young and old alike.

The play is a staging of Jesus' passion, covering the short final period of his life from His entrance into Jerusalem to His death on the Cross. The text of the play is a composite of four distinct manuscripts dating from between the 15th and 16th centuries.

We are organizing a pilgrimage in August of 2020 that will include our participation in the Oberammergau Passion Play. Truly, a once in a lifetime opportunity. Along with the unique chance to view the Passion Play, we are also planning to visit significant sites such as Vienna, Salzburg and Prague where we celebrate Mass in the church that contains the famous Statue of the Infant of Prague and on to Poland for a visit to the Shrine of the Divine Mercy and to the place of birth of St. John Paul II, among other things.

For more information on this unique opportunity, please join us for an information\registration meeting on Thursday, **February 7th at 7:00 pm in the downstairs meeting room**. Because of the extraordinary nature of this event (once every 10 years and people booking tickets from around the world), in order to secure places we must make reservations early.
