### THE SACRED LITURGY THIS WEEK

**Tuesday, January 31,** <u>St. John Bosco</u> (1815-1888 Patron Saint of Editors and Children). Born into a noble Naples family he was an exceptional student and joined the Franciscans in 1243 despite the severe opposition of his family. He taught in many European Universities and is the preeminent spokesman of the Catholic tradition of reason and of divine revelation. Throughout his life he had prophetic dreams; several of which inspired his ministry to the service of abandoned young people. He began his ministry to the young with free catechism classes after Sunday Mass which soon grew into a full-fledged school where boys could receive an education, learn a trade, and love Jesus. His teaching methods were based on love rather than punishment.

**Thursday, February 2,** <u>The Presentation of the Lord.</u> The purpose of this day is "to help the entire Church to esteem ever more greatly the witness of those persons who have chosen to follow Christ by means of the practice of the evangelical counsels" as well as "to be a suitable occasion for consecrated persons to renew their commitment and rekindle the fervor which should inspire their offering of themselves to the Lord". #### FEB 2 - WORLD DAY FOR CONSECRATED LIFE "MODERN MAN LISTENS MORE WILLINGLY TO WITNESSES THAN TO TEACHERS"

The mission of the consecrated life in the present and in the future of the Church, concerns not merely those who have received this special charism, but the entire Christian community. The purpose of such a day is threefold: First it answers the intimate need to praise the Lord more solemnly and to thank him for the great gift of consecrated life, which enriches and gladdens the Christian community. "What would become of the world if there were no religious?" They, by a gift of the Spirit enliven and sustain the Church in its demanding journey through this world.

Second: this day is intended to promote knowledge of, and esteem for, the consecrated life by the entire People of God. This form of life, embraced by Christ and made present particularly by consecrated persons, is of great importance for the Church, called in every member to live the same upward striving toward God who is All, following Christ in the light and power of the Holy Spirit.

Third: consecrated persons are invited to celebrate together solemnly the marvels which the Lord has accomplished in them, and to acquire a more vivid consciousness of their irreplaceable mission in the Church and in the world. Immersed in a world which is often agitated and distracted, taken up sometimes by the press of responsibilities, consecrated persons also will be helped to return to the sources of their vocation, to take stock of their own lives, to confirm the commitment of their own consecration.

#### BLESSING OF THROATS ON THE FEAST OF ST. BLAISE

St. Blaise was a physician at Sebaste (in present day Turkey) before he became a bishop. At the time of the persecution under Licinius he was taken prisoner at the command of the Governor Agricoulaus after the hunters of the governor found him in the wilderness in a cave to which he had retired. While in prison he performed a wonderful cure of a boy who was in danger of choking to death. After suffering various forms of torture for upholding his Christian faith rather than apostatizing, he was beheaded about 316 A.D.

On his feast day the blessing of Throats can be given. Two candles are consecrated and held in a crossed position by the priest who gives a blessing while touching the throat of the person requesting the blessing.
